## DIVINE HEALING & ETERNAL LIFE PATHWAY (PAID FOR BY JESUS' WORK OF ATONEMENT)

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The great value of trusting God for healing is the spiritual results we gain from receiving that victory from God. Divine healing carries with it every spiritual blessing that we need; repentance, pardon, and cleansing of sin, also an in-filling of God's righteousness and God's peace within, and most importantly, it is a 'step forward' on our pathway to Eternal Life. Jesus made that very clear in the case of the army Captain who came to Him (Matt.8) and said (vs.6-8), "Sir, my servant at home is lying ill with paralysis and is suffering great pain." "I will come and cure him," said Jesus. "Sir," replied the Captain, "I am not a fit person to receive you under my roof: merely say the word and my servant will be cured." (Vs.10-12) "Jesus listened to this reply, and was astonished, and said to the people following Him, "I solemnly tell you that in no Israelite have I found faith as great as this. And I tell you that many will come from the east and from the west and will recline at table with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the "Kingdom of the Heavens", while the natural heirs of the Kingdom will be driven out into the darkness outside: there will be the weeping aloud and the gnashing of teeth."

<u>Those words of Jesus clearly emphasize</u> that <u>trusting God for</u> <u>healing of our body, can determine WHERE we will spend our eternity</u> (<u>Heaven or the Lake of Fire</u>). There are also other points connected to divine healing that emphasize these spiritual aspects. Jesus said, (John 12:24), "In most solemn truth I tell you that unless the grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains what it was--a single grain; but that if it dies, it yields a rich harvest." (When 'self' is <u>eliminated</u> and <u>dies within our heart</u>, and <u>is replaced with</u> a '<u>divine nature'</u>, it yields rich harvest.)

Jesus was talking about us <u>dying to self</u> (eliminating)'trust in the '<u>self-life'</u> (or trusting in ourselves or other <u>human beings</u> and human <u>plans</u>) instead of trusting on God. When self is eliminated and replaced by a divine nature in our heart, a rich harvest of spiritual growth is yielded. When we depend on anything human for something we need or desire in this life, to that extent the 'devil' and 'self' within have that much control and influence over us. However, when we are not using self-efforts, and all known sin is confessed and every human thing to depend upon is out of the way, the full power of God will go to work immediately (almost before we had time to ask for it). These conditions we meet to receive healing from God, will however, strike a fatal blow to those two deceitful enemies of all mankind, which <u>are 'self'</u> and the <u>devil</u>.

The basis of the devil's control is to have us to depend on something human instead of depending on God, (Who sent His Son to give His life-blood for us, that we might take our healing by faith on His <u>Word</u>). (As the message title states) "healing <u>is in</u> the Atonement" work of Christ. (Isaiah 53:4-5) "And, <u>ours</u> was the <u>pain</u> <u>He</u> bore, the <u>sorrow</u> He endured! We thought Him suffering from a stroke at God's hand; yet <u>He</u> was <u>wounded</u> <u>because</u> <u>we</u> had <u>sinned</u>, twas our misdeeds that crushed Him; twas for our welfare that He was chastised, the <u>blows</u> that <u>fell</u> to <u>Him</u> have <u>brought</u> <u>us</u> <u>HEALING</u>. But He was wounded for <u>our</u> <u>transgres-</u> <u>sions</u> He was bruised for <u>our iniquities</u>; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed."

Jesus again <u>emphasized</u> (John 12:25), that the <u>spiritual</u> side of receiving healing through a trusting faith on God, <u>does</u> indeed <u>determine</u> where we will spend our eternity. "He who holds his life dear, is destroying it; and he who makes his life of no account in this world, shall keep it to the Life of the Ages."

When we begin to trust on God for health of our body, that is the attitude we are taking. We risk our life on God's <u>Word</u> and faithfulness to His Promises. Where there is no risk involved (in other words if we can see the thing that we are trusting on), then there is no faith involved. <u>Real faith</u> can only be exercised on something that we <u>cannot see</u>. That, in itself is of the greatest value to our spiritual life, <u>because</u> it is the definition of an acting faith, and it makes us a <u>true disciple</u> of Jesus Christ. That is what it did for <u>believers</u> in the Bible, such as the Roman army Captain who said to Jesus, "merely say the word and my servant will be cured." No wonder the Bible says that Jesus marveled at the man's faith on His Word (instead of needing to see Jesus come and heal the servant). The man was '<u>Seeing</u> in <u>Faith</u>' and his <u>prayer</u> was <u>answered</u>. We can <u>all</u> have that <u>same answer</u> to <u>our</u> prayers of faith, today.

Jesus told us in plain words, Mark 11:22, "<u>Have faith in God</u>." How many people really have true Bible-believing faith in God, for Him to actually <u>be</u> their God <u>in</u> everything <u>and for</u> everything? (Hebr. 11:6 says) "<u>Without faith it is impossible</u> to please God, because anyone who comes to him <u>must believe</u> that He exists and that He <u>rewards</u> those who earnestly seek Him." (The Apostle Paul said, "We live by faith, not by sight,"(2 Cor. 5:7).

When we consider how simple and easy it is to 'walk by faith' (after we have right understanding of 'faith'), and, when we realize that all(and every) divine blessing, healing, and deliverance <u>comes</u> <u>through faith</u>,...it would be most <u>unfortunate</u> to <u>not</u> exercise real saving faith in God, (and so, for us to <u>receive</u> all that God has provided through the Atonement work of His Son.)

As we read a word (or hear a word), we picture things <u>as</u> that word says. That is all faith really <u>is</u>,... accepting the words and picturing victorious results. It is quite easy and <u>un</u>complicated.

If it is easy to accept the spoken or written words of a trustworthy human being, how much easier then should it be to accept the written Words of a trustworthy (and divine) God? That is what the 'walk of faith' actually is...seeing (or accepting) things as <u>God's</u> written <u>Words</u> say that they are.

The written Scriptures tell of God's <u>'Promises'</u> to His true people... (all those who are <u>faithful</u> followers of <u>His</u> <u>Son</u> <u>Jesus</u>). (Hebr.10:23 tells us, "He who promised is faithful."

If we can accept what God's Word says as being absolute <u>truth</u>, then we should have no trouble to 'walk by faith,' and we should experience no difficulty to receive answer to our prayers, <u>because God</u> is <u>all-powerful</u>. We will be enabled by the Holy Spirit to <u>understand</u> that any and <u>all opposition</u> we may meet <u>is from</u> the <u>devil</u>, so it <u>must</u> be rejected and refused in the Name of Jesus.

The first condition for receiving healing is <u>repentance</u>, which is extremely valuable for us to know, <u>because there is</u> always a <u>spiritual</u> <u>cause</u> for any attack in our body. It can be that we have accepted discouragement, or lies and fear from the devil, instead of believing God's Word which says that we are healed by the atonement Blood of Jesus Christ. We must repent of our accepting the devil's discouragements and fear and repent of any known sin in our life. When <u>the cause for the oppression</u> is <u>revealed</u> and we have sincerely repented and made a final <u>commitment</u> to trust God, it not only brings pardon and cleansing of sin, but the <u>spiritual grace</u> is provided that we need to take our victory by faith on the Atonement Promises of God.

The spiritual grace received from placing real faith on God, is the reason Satan has always opposed our trusting God for health of body, (and why he fought against divine healing all through Jesus' ministry on earth), because it teaches people to have faith on God's faithfulness to His Word (instead of believing Satan's lies). When Jesus healed a man with a withered arm, Satan controlled <u>un</u>believers began plotting how to kill Jesus, because the devil does not want anyone to have faith in God for health and healing of body.

The question then, is not how much faith we have, but <u>how</u> <u>faithful</u> is the <u>God we have</u>? The only questions we need to consider would be: 'Is God always true to His Word? Can any statement He makes be accepted without question?' We are to deal only with the facts, (and not even consider faith, which we will naturally <u>have if</u> we truly believe in the fulfillment of God's Word).

In human situations we always deal with facts. When we determine what  $\underline{is}$  fact, we then believe it without actually being conscious that we have accepted it as a fact. We know it to be a fact, so it is natural for us to accept it.

In a similar way we exercise our faith in God without really thinking about the faith part of the matter. <u>That is</u> 'walking by faith.' When we consider the facts about what kind of a God we pray to, and is He reliable, honest, and trustworthy?... and we answer ourselves 'Yes'... the next thing is we must <u>act on</u> those facts.

Every true Christian believes that God is fully reliable, honest, and trustworthy...and that His Promises are always the truth. That means we can have a perfect faith in a perfect God, because faith has all to do with the One we are dealing with, NOT anything within ourselves. Because we <u>believe</u> that <u>God</u> is fully <u>reliable</u>, we should be able to exercise perfect faith in Him without really being conscious of doing so.

If we follow the devil's suggestions, however, to ask ourselves how much faith we have, then he can deceive us, and this will block our answers to prayer. (James 1:6) "Let him ask in faith and have no doubts; for he who has doubts is like the surge of the sea, driven by the wind and tossed into spray."

The truth is, it is simply a freewill choice on our part to believe on a faithful God, and to accept His Word and Promises, so anyone can 'walk by faith' at any time. "The chastisement of our peace was upon Him," means that anything that could disturb our peace in the least possible way, was nailed to the Cross with Jesus Christ (and we do not have to bear a disturbance which was already born for us). Pain and discomfort in our body can greatly disturb our peace, but in Jesus' Name we don't have to accept that.

The next part of that verse (Isaiah 53:5), is (and should be) all-comprehensive to us, "by His stripes we are healed." Those statements were made by God in these verses, and they refer directly to our healing, so God knew the importance of 'spiritual blessing' received through our faith for divine healing.

There are New Testament examples of people meeting Jesus for the first time, and they exercised perfect faith in Him right away. We can surely assume that Satan the 'father of lies' (John 8:44), was there to try to deceive them at that moment, in the same way Satan tries to deceive us now, when we pray.

The <u>next</u> 'condition of <u>faith'</u> to be met (<u>after repenting</u> and <u>believing</u> that God <u>is faithful</u> to His <u>Word</u>), is to accept God's bare word alone as <u>evidence</u> that we <u>are</u> healed without yet seeing or feeling the healing (for there is no faith where no risk is involved). As we meet those conditions, the Holy Spirit will enable us to make a final decision to risk our life on the faithfulness of God's Promises. That eliminates every foothold of 'self' and Satan in our life (and that is the place to which God must bring each one of us).

There is an example in John 4, of "a nobleman whose son was sick". (Vs. 47), "When this man heard that Jesus had arrived in Galilee from Judea, he went to him and begged him to come and heal his son, who was close to death." [ the <u>following pages of this message on</u> <u>divine healing</u>, are a true <u>example</u> and <u>explanation</u> of the 'true faith' and the 'true pathway' that leads to Eternal Life, and should inspire true faith for divine healing through the 'power of Jesus' Blood (a <u>sacrificial</u> 'work of Atonement') It is the victorious Christian 'life of faith', all wrapped up in one example and explanation as God inspired it to be written for us (John 4:47-53). ] Instead of Jesus saying that <u>He would</u> (or would not) go with the man to heal the boy, Jesus says(vs.48) "<u>Unless you and others see</u> miracles and marvels, <u>nothing will induce you to believe</u>."

Jesus <u>meant</u> that the man was <u>not convinced</u> in his own mind, and that he <u>did not believe</u> that <u>God's Word meant what it says</u>. Jesus is <u>telling us</u> that <u>many people</u> only went by what they could feel (or what they actually saw with their eyes.) They <u>would not accept God's Word</u> as sufficient evidence, He meant, so they were not `walking by faith.'

Surely, Satan had suggested many negative and doubtful things to that man, <u>such as</u> Jesus being <u>only</u> a man, <u>or</u>, that <u>the boy would not</u> <u>be healed just because someone said he was healed</u>.

The man did not give up, however, and said (vs.49)"Sir, come down before my child dies." He was persistent (which was good), but he wanted to `see' Jesus touch and heal the boy (which would not be `faith in a spoken Word,' nor would it be the pure `walk of faith.' Jesus replied (Vs.50) "You may return home, your son has recovered."

At that moment, the man could either <u>accept</u> those words or <u>not</u> <u>accept</u> them. He could exercise absolute faith in those words (only), and return home to see the boy delivered, <u>or</u> he could have said that he <u>would not accept just 'words'</u> for <u>his son's healing</u>, ... <u>but</u> that, he wanted to 'see' the <u>healing being accomplished</u>.

The example that we <u>have</u>, however, is that the man <u>did accept</u> Jesus' Words as being a <u>true fact</u>, and he took <u>an actual</u> <u>walk of</u> <u>faith'</u> back to his home to see his son <u>well</u> and <u>fully recovered</u>. The man <u>refused to see defeat</u> (as <u>Satan</u> surely <u>pictured it</u>). <u>Instead</u>, he <u>accepted victory</u> <u>as God promised</u> it. The actual words are (vs 50): "He believed the words of Jesus and started back home."

The Word of God (spoken by Jesus Christ), presented a mental picture to the man's mind. He only had words to portray to his <u>mind</u> what took place, for he did <u>not</u> actually <u>see</u> any healing (at that moment). Sight, feeling, and Satan's suggestions are all <u>opposite</u> to <u>faith</u>. They were <u>opposite</u> then, and they <u>are opposite</u> now. In the <u>Name of Jesus, we must reject Satan's lies</u> and <u>suggestions</u>, and <u>believe</u> the Words of <u>our faithful</u> God, which <u>say</u> to <u>us</u>, "The <u>chastisement for our peace</u> was upon Him, And by <u>His</u> stripes we are healed."

The man had a responsibility to fulfill (just as you and I do) ... he had to choose whether he was going to accept the Words of Jesus or not accept them. That officer had to exercise his 'power of choice' to believe or not believe. He could 'walk by faith' or he could insist by sight. He made the choice, however, to believe that the boy was exactly as God's Word said he was... "fully healed".

As the man came near his house he heard more words, but this time from eyewitnesses (Vs 51 says) "He was already on his way down when his servants met him and told him that his son was alive and well."

It was easier to accept those words from eye-witnesses because they saw what actually took place. And yet the 'Word of God' (from Jesus His Son) was <u>more</u> <u>true</u>, <u>more</u> <u>real</u>, and <u>safer</u> for that man to <u>believe</u>, than even the words of the servants (who had actually seen the deliverance with their own eyes).'

(MAIN POINT) If the man would not have believed the Word of God and would not have held onto that promise from God's Son, he would not have received the healing of his boy.

At the moment when that man accepted the words Jesus spoke to him, he was not aware that he had exercised faith. He never thought of faith, nor did he consider whether he had a 'certain amount of faith'. <u>Rather</u>, the man just considered the 'Words' that were spoken to him, and he considered Who spoke those words. He thought only about whether he should (or should not) have faith in those words.

However, the man fully accepted the Words Jesus <u>spoke</u>, just <u>the</u> <u>same as we can accept</u> the <u>Words</u> Jesus <u>Christ speaks</u> to <u>us</u> (<u>through</u> <u>written Scriptures</u>). The man <u>believed</u> God's Word (<u>that is</u> the <u>key</u>) and <u>he 'walked by faith' in those Words</u>. It was a <u>pure</u> and perfect <u>faith</u> being exercised, (without his even being conscious of doing so).

It is the same today (and everyone has that same choice to make today). We are not to consider how we may feel, what we may see, and certainly not pay any attention to what defeat Satan suggests to our mind. We are only to 'walk by faith' in what <u>God's Word has said</u>. We are to consider what has the shed blood of Jesus done for us? What does that Atonement for sins actually mean to a true believer today?'

We <u>are not to consider</u> the amount of faith we can exercise, <u>but</u> <u>only what Christ has already done for us on the Cross</u>. We are <u>not</u> to think about what we can DO to become righteous, <u>nor</u> what we can DO to be healed, <u>nor</u> what we can DO to find peace, but what has Christ DONE <u>and accomplished for us</u> on Calvary's Cross? When we turn our trust toward someone <u>else</u> or 'some <u>other</u> plan for ourselves and our family', then we are (as the late Pastor would say), "<u>ignoring what</u> the <u>Blood</u> of <u>Christ has provided</u> for us and <u>throwing God's</u> 'overtures of <u>mercy'</u> to the winds."

(Hebr. 10:38-39) "But the <u>righteous</u> will <u>live</u> by <u>faith</u>. And if he shrinks back, I will <u>not</u> be <u>pleased</u> with <u>him</u>." But we are <u>not</u> of <u>those</u> who <u>shrink</u> <u>back</u> (and <u>are</u> <u>destroyed</u>), but of those who <u>believe</u> and are saved."

Yes, our healing is written in the Atonement Promises about a work Jesus Christ accomplished for us on the Cross. "Twas for our welfare that He was chastised, the blows that fell to Him have brought us <u>HEALING</u>. But He was wounded for our transgressions He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed."

YES, DIVINE HEALING IS IN THE ATONEMENT WORK OF JESUS CHRIST !!
