(FOR A SUCCESSFUL CHRISTIAN LIFE OF FAITH)

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Living a successful Christian life is an important subject for <u>everyone</u> on earth to seriously consider, as each one <u>strives</u> "with my eyes fixed on the goal (as Apostle Paul said) I <u>push on</u> to <u>secure</u> the prize of God's heavenward call in Christ Jesus." (Phil.3:14).

A true Christian life begins by first <u>believing</u> God's Word about what His Son, Jesus Christ, accomplished <u>for us</u> on the Cross. God's Message about His <u>only</u> Son was <u>given us</u> <u>through</u> His Son (His Apostles who followed, and Moses and other Prophets before them). They <u>all</u> told of the coming 'Messiah' <u>who</u> would bring a 'Message of Salvation' from God. God's <u>Message</u> really <u>means</u> a <u>promise</u> of everlasting <u>'Life'</u>,... for everyone who will <u>listen</u> and <u>believe</u> on it. Believing the Message enables a person to accept it in their heart.

When a person willingly accepts God's <u>Message</u>, it allows for the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to take control of every action and decision in their life. <u>Without</u> the guidance of the Holy Spirit, no one can be made ready for Eternal Life. It is work of an indwelling Holy Spirit that <u>sanctifies</u> a person and prepares them to be worthy of God's Kingdom. Jesus told Paul (Acts 26:18) "I send you to open their eyes, that they may <u>turn</u> from darkness to light and <u>from</u> the <u>obedience</u> to <u>Satan</u>, to <u>God</u>, in order to receive <u>forgiveness</u> of sins and an inheritance, among those who are sanctified through faith in Me."

That is why it's so important to understand and believe God's Message about the redeeming work that His Son accomplished for us on Calvary's Cross. We must believe to receive the Holy Spirit to be our guide. The Apostle reminded unbelieving and rebellious Jews (Acts 5:30-32) "The God of our forefathers has raised Jesus to life, whom you crucified and put to death. God has exalted Him to His right hand as Chief Leader and as Savior, to give Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses as to these things and so is the Holy Spirit which God has given to those who obey Him."

Jesus brought to us His Father's Message (about Himself) (John 12:44) "Jesus cried aloud, "He who believes in me, believes not so much in me, as in <u>Him</u> who sent me; and he who sees <u>me</u>, sees Him who sent me."

<u>Multitudes</u> came to <u>hear</u> Jesus! (Luke 12:1 says, <u>tens</u> of <u>thousands</u>), but (although they <u>heard</u>), many(most) were not <u>listening</u> (spiritually) and were not willing to <u>follow</u> Jesus Who was teaching them that we should <u>follow</u> His example (which <u>means</u> to <u>obey</u> <u>His</u> <u>teaching</u>, which <u>are</u> His commands), and so, enjoy the love He shows toward us. (John 15:10 Jesus said), "<u>If</u> you <u>obey</u> my commands, you will <u>continue</u> in <u>my love</u>, as I have obeyed my Father's commands and <u>continue</u> in His love." [It is <u>by</u> an <u>enduring</u> <u>faith</u> that the Spirit enables us to <u>obey</u> the commands of Jesus Christ, and thus, <u>continue</u> within <u>His</u> <u>grace</u> and <u>love</u>, instead of <u>`falling away'</u> from it.] Instead of listening and being willing to obey (follow) <u>Jesus</u>, multitudes of people turned their backs on His teaching (just as most do today), and they <u>left</u> Jesus. They left Him to follow their <u>own will</u> of the self-life (which they were born with), rather than give that up to <u>follow</u> God's <u>Message</u> through His Son, Jesus Christ.

So, Jesus seriously warned those who came to hear Him, but who were not listening, (Luke 12:48), "He who sets me at naught and does not receive my teachings is not left without a judge: the 'Message' which I have spoken will judge him on the last day, [because His Message was also written down for everyone else to read (or hear), and to follow in life] (Vs.49-50) "Because I have not spoken on my own authority; but the Father who sent me, Himself gave me a command what to say and in what words to speak. And I know that His command is the Life of the Ages. What therefore I speak, I speak just as the Father has bidden me."(to speak to us).

The Apostle Peter gave <u>'God's Message'</u> to <u>Cornelius</u> and <u>his</u> <u>household</u>, (Acts 10:). He did <u>not</u> <u>commend</u> them for any <u>good</u> <u>deeds</u> <u>on</u> <u>their</u> part. He just told them about <u>what</u> Jesus Christ had already <u>accomplished</u> for us on Calvary's Cross. And <u>because</u> they <u>believed</u> the '<u>Message'</u> (which Peter referred to as the "<u>Good</u> <u>News</u> of <u>peace</u> through Jesus Christ"), the Bible <u>says</u>, that "the <u>Holy</u> <u>Spirit</u> fell on all who were <u>listening</u> to the Message". (They were not just <u>hearing</u> the message, they were <u>also</u> '<u>listening'</u> and <u>willing</u> to <u>follow</u> Jesus' <u>example</u> of His <u>obedience</u> toward <u>His</u> Father. By their <u>believing</u> the Message, they had met '<u>God's</u> <u>condition</u> to <u>receive'</u> the indwelling Holy Spirit in His fullness (to understand His message).

<u>God's Message</u> given through His Son, <u>teaches people how to be</u> <u>Christlike</u>, so that a person can be a Christian 'light' to shine for others to see and follow (as Jesus <u>said</u> that we <u>should</u>). It contains teaching and examples of receiving perfect <u>healing</u>, enjoying good <u>health</u>, and the <u>protection</u> of our body. It also contains very solemn teaching (along with examples), on how to <u>trust God financially</u>, as well as to trust Him to be in control of the '<u>home life</u>', so that 'His Peace' can <u>be enjoyed</u>. It teaches us <u>not</u> to <u>avenge</u> wrongs that are done toward us, but, that <u>God is</u> to <u>avenge</u> all <u>injustices</u>.

However, <u>until</u> one '<u>believes'</u> God's Message to receive the Holy Spirit (<u>as</u> Cornelius' household <u>did</u>), the human nature of their heart does <u>not</u> let them <u>follow</u> those teachings. We were all born under the power of Satan and with the evil nature of self in us, so we <u>must trust</u> the Holy Spirit to <u>take</u> that 'self' from our heart. While still having that evil nature in us, it would be impossible to find any <u>true</u> happiness in our life here on earth, or to get into Heaven. That evil nature (born in all of us), is the most terrible, wicked, deceitful character that we could have in us.

The Prophet Jeremiah, <u>described</u> the human <u>heart</u> (meaning, the evil <u>nature</u>). He said (Jer.17:9), "The human heart is deceitful above all things and desperately wicked." He explained that a person having the evil nature in them, could not even know it (of themselves), for he also then posed a question, "who could know it". <u>Nobody</u> can know it because that deceitful nature lies <u>deep</u> <u>within</u> the human <u>heart</u>. Only God can search our heart for us, and that is why our commitment and surrender to Him must be <u>sincere</u> and <u>without compromise</u>. <u>Then</u> we can receive the indwelling Holy Spirit who will <u>search out</u> our heart and <u>reveal where</u> Satan is hiding. (Jer. 17:10), "I, the Lord, search the heart, I <u>test</u> the <u>mind</u>, Even to give every man according to his ways, According to the <u>fruit</u> of his doings."

God also uses His <u>Word</u> to <u>test</u> <u>our mind</u> (when we read or hear His Word). (Heb.4:12-13) "For God's <u>Message</u> (His Word) is full of <u>life</u> and <u>power</u> and is <u>keener</u> than the sharpest two-edged sword. It <u>pierces</u> even to the <u>severance</u> of <u>soul</u> from <u>spirit</u>, and penetrates between the joints and the marrow, and it can <u>discern</u> the <u>secret</u> <u>thoughts</u> and <u>purposes</u> of the <u>heart</u>. And <u>no</u> <u>created</u> <u>thing</u> is able to <u>escape</u> its <u>scrutiny</u>; but <u>everything</u> lies bare and completely <u>exposed</u> before the eyes of Him with whom we have to do."

It is by knowledge of God's Word that we are to compare things (and our attitudes) with His Word. (2 Cor.13:5), "Test yourselves to discover whether you are true believers: put your own selves under examination. Or do you not know that Jesus Christ is within you, unless you are insincere?" (or "unless of course you fail the test?")

People belonging to <u>denominational</u> Churches may sometimes say, "I am as good as anyone <u>else</u>" (the Pastor said). (Or), "I am as dedicated as any other church member. I pay my tithes and give some to the poor. I have a good chance (as any other church member), of being righteous in God's sight."

"Such professing Christians actually don't stand a chance of being declared righteous (if they remain in <u>that</u> spiritual condition). Honesty, sincerity, and outward actions is <u>not true</u> <u>Christianity</u>. Those <u>surface</u> actions never take anybody to Heaven. They are not 'faith in action'. The <u>only thing</u> that <u>will open the</u> <u>way into Heaven</u>, is for a person to <u>follow the divine plan</u> laid down <u>in God's Word</u> for living a true Christian life" of <u>faith and trust</u>, (which was given by the very humble <u>example</u> of the Savior, Himself. He did not avenge wrongs, <u>did not</u> trust in medicine, nor even have anything laid-up for <u>tomorrow</u>). We have Bible examples to make it even more understandable, and perfectly clear to us, how easy and effectually it will work out, if we follow Christ's humble example.

It takes <u>three</u> <u>things</u> to make a genuine Christian, ... which <u>includes</u> getting completely and <u>entirely rid</u> of that inborn <u>evil</u> <u>nature</u> (and all the influence of the devil). All three things must take place in the true Christian's life.

The <u>first</u> is, 'the Pardon and Cleansing of Sin', which is our <u>Blood-bought right</u> to <u>have</u>, because it <u>was done for us</u> on the Cross. We have to '<u>believe'</u> for that privilege, however, ... the same as we are to 'believe' on God for everything else in our 'life of faith' and our total <u>dependance</u> on Him. Our 'Pardon and Cleansing of Sin', is just one step.

Jesus said, "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." "A vast number of religious people arrive at their

conclusion that when Jesus said if a person was born again, and pardoned and cleansed, they would enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Because of that <u>assumption</u>, they <u>think</u> that every one who was 'born again', was sure to go to Heaven."

"The teaching 'Once saved, always saved', started that <u>delusion</u> <u>from that particular</u> verse (the late Pastor said). It is similar to the belief of other groups of 'Holiness people'. The first question they ask when they see you, is, "have you been born again?"...(while at the same time they <u>reject</u> the <u>true Bible teaching</u>" of faithful endurance and <u>spiritual growth</u>). We may hear professed Christians in the world asking each other, "<u>are you saved?</u>", or "<u>was</u> he (or she) saved?", <u>or</u> we will hear, "yes, he (or she) <u>was</u> saved". At the same time the majority of them <u>ignore</u> God's many <u>warnings</u> through Jesus Christ and His Apostles, ... that is, we must <u>be careful not</u> to be deceived, and, to not fall away from 'faith in Christ'.

However, we very seldom see any <u>fruits</u> of <u>repentance</u>, or any real <u>commitment</u> to follow God's Word, nor do we hear of them <u>doing</u> God's Will, by <u>trusting</u> on His Son (instead of depending on <u>human</u> plans and efforts).

"That is positive proof that they have <u>not</u> actually been 'born again' <u>(nor pardoned and cleansed from sin)</u>. They only have a <u>theoretical</u> knowledge of some passages of Bible text, but <u>no</u> real genuine <u>change</u> of <u>heart</u>, <u>nor</u> any pardon and cleansing from sin. Their smooth and persuasive talk is very <u>deceitful</u>, and it is human effort. In reality, it just proves that they are still under the control of the old evil nature (that every human was born with)."

"They trust in the ways and plans of man for things and have not learned to trust <u>God</u> even for food for their table, nor to trust Him to heal the slightest pain in their body (because of their '<u>lack</u> of <u>faith'</u> and <u>unbelief</u>). That in itself is positive proof of such people being in a delusion, under the <u>control</u> of the devil, and the old evil nature inherited from Adam. Trusting in other things (or people) is <u>unbelief</u> in God (in reality) and <u>is</u> the sin of <u>idolatry</u> (one of the worst sins, as Paul explained in his letters). If one cannot trust on God's promises for lessor things in this life, how could they expect to <u>trust Him for their Salvation</u>, and for the Holy Spirit to prepare them spiritually to meet Jesus Christ when He comes again for His true believers?

It would be just as <u>unrealistic</u> to say, that because a boy was born in the United States of America, he was sure to become President (because he is a male citizen born in the United States. Many a male citizen was born in this country and yet did not reach the Presidency. Those 'Holiness' and 'Once saved always saved' people who think we <u>only</u> have to be verbally 'born again' to get to Heaven, haven't the slightest chance for it (without a true <u>repentance</u>). They don't <u>define</u> God's Word right, <u>nor</u> do they <u>give</u> a correct <u>definition</u> of 'Salvation by grace through an enduring faith (as the late Pastor said).

Nicodemus was a Jewish teacher, but with that old evil nature still in him, he could not define God's Word (due to not having the

Holy Spirit), for Jesus said, that the Holy Spirit is not for the <u>unbeliever</u>. Nicodemus did not know a thing about God's <u>Truth</u>, and he could not <u>trust</u> God for anything. That is why Jesus told him that he <u>needed</u> to take the <u>`first step'</u> in the <u>divine</u> life. Jesus <u>repeated</u> that Nicodemus <u>needed</u> to be <u>`born again'</u>, to receive the new birth; (which would be <u>complete</u> change of <u>`heart attitude'</u>). Then <u>God's</u> Spirit could work in his life.

Astonished by this true meaning of Scripture, Nicodemus asked, "How is it possible for a man to be born when he is old?" (He had no idea of what it meant to be 'born again of the Spirit'.)

<u>Many outwardly sincere people</u> (being ignorant of the <u>true</u> condition of their <u>heart</u>), <u>think</u> they are full of faith; when in reality, they are <u>full</u> of <u>unbelief</u> (which is the <u>most grievous</u> of all sins). Many people of the world think that they have to <u>feel</u> an "experience" to receive and have the Holy Spirit. But that is <u>not</u> the way the Holy Spirit works. Jesus told Nicodemus (John 3:8) "The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it is going; <u>so is it</u> with everyone who has been <u>born of the Spirit</u>." (9-10) "How is all this possible?" asked Nicodemus. "Are you," replied Jesus, "`the Teacher of Israel,' and yet do you not understand these things?"

We all need to realize that outward "experiences" can be used by the devil to <u>distract</u> a person away from <u>real</u> spirituality, and to have them to think that they are a spiritually better person (as Nicodemus did), <u>because</u> of their <u>outward</u> <u>religion</u>. Outward piety <u>is</u> <u>spiritually harmful</u> to <u>true</u> spirituality (regarding <u>right</u> <u>choices</u> and <u>decisions</u> in one's life), (which are to be inspired by the Holy Spirit from <u>within</u> a person's <u>heart</u>, ... <u>not</u> by <u>outward</u> <u>gestures</u> to <u>prompt</u> a <u>spiritual</u> 'experience'). As Jesus explained, one <u>must</u> be 'born again' <u>of</u> <u>the</u> <u>Spirit</u>'.

The 'Holiness' groups (and 'Once save always saved' people) who think we only have to be <u>born again</u> to get to Heaven, have not the slightest chance for Heaven (<u>without a true repentance</u>). (Without the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit), they do not <u>define</u> God's Word right, nor do they give the correct definition of His Word.

Everyone must be aware of the imminent 'spiritual danger' of their false teaching given in their many <u>books</u>, <u>tracts</u>, (and any other <u>publishing</u>), because the <u>devil</u> is <u>playing</u> for keeps, to take your <u>soul</u> to the Lake of Fire. Jesus warned us of the teachers of false doctrines, saying, "beneath that <u>'disguise'</u> they are ravenous wolves. <u>By their fruits</u> you will <u>easily recognize them</u>."

The <u>next thing</u> to <u>take place</u> to <u>become</u> a <u>genuine</u> <u>Christian is</u> <u>also only a step</u>. It is <u>not</u> the entire Christian life, <u>and</u> it does not give anyone a <u>through ticket to Heaven</u>,... but, <u>it is a very</u> <u>important and valuable step toward</u> Heaven. This second step is a <u>total commitment</u> of our life to have an <u>enduring faith</u> on God's Word, for His 'will' to be done in our life, and for His <u>Word</u> to be our 'rule of life'. (Rom.12:1-2 says it best, "I beseech (earnestly implore) you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And <u>do not be conformed to this</u> world, but <u>be</u> <u>transformed</u> by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of <u>God</u>."

So, to be 'born again', and then to make a 'total commitment' to follow Christ (as if we are a 'living sacrifice'), are only <u>two</u> <u>steps</u>, but they pave the way for the third and most important of all steps, and that is to have the '<u>self-life</u>' removed from our <u>heart</u>. That third step... <u>must take place</u>,... for a person to enter God's Kingdom,... <u>but</u> steps one and two need to be carried out first in our life. We first <u>must 'believe'</u> and '<u>repent'</u> to be 'born again', and to then make a sincere and 'total commitment' to follow <u>Jesus</u> <u>Christ's example</u> for us to <u>trust God</u> for all aspects of our life, so that we can have Him (God) remove 'self' from our heart. (Which we must allow Him to do, so that we can indeed be "born again of the Spirit" (as Jesus said must take place for us to be <u>perfected in</u> <u>Christ</u> and <u>prepared for Eternal Life</u>.) (John 3:3) "unless a man is born anew he cannot see the Kingdom of God." (SELF REMOVED, AND PRRPARED TO MEET JESUS FOR ETERNITY !!)

S324R/ The MAIN POINTS...of the "NECESSAEY FUNDAMENTAL STEPS (FOR A SUCCESSFUL; CHRISTIAN LIFE OF FAITH":

 Believing and accepting God's Message (sent through His Son), enables a person to <u>begin</u> a successful Christian life, and should inspire true <u>repentance</u> and baptism to receive the Holy Spirit.
Listening to God's Message about His Son, <u>believing</u> it, and having a <u>willingness</u> to follow that teaching,... enabled people in Bible times to receive the <u>free gift</u> of the Holy Spirit.
A choice on our part to make a sincere commitment to Christ, is what allows us to be 'born again' of the Spirit (as Jesus said we <u>must</u> be).

4. It is the sanctifying work that indwelling Spirit which will remove the <u>nature</u> of '<u>self</u>' from our heart, and that is the <u>most</u> <u>important</u> thing that '<u>must'</u> take place in the life of every believer. Having the 'self-life' removed is the only way that one can be 'perfected in Christ' and prepared for <u>Eternal Life</u>.
