SOULS WHO TRUST GOD (ARE GUIDED BY HIS SPIRIT)

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A Christian who has a <u>thirst</u> to know God's <u>Word</u> and what His 'will' is for everyone, is very fortunate to have a complete volume of Truth as the Bible contains for us. In reality, His Word has <u>everything</u> that we need and ought to <u>know</u> about <u>God's</u> 'will' for us. He sent the Holy Spirit to teach that, and to inspire us from within our heart (so we should not expect or need to receive special revelation from God). (Heb 1:1-2) "In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, but in <u>these last days</u> he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed <u>heir</u> of <u>all</u> things, and through whom he made the universe."

All that God told us through His Son (also the Apostles, and the prophets before), has been <u>written</u> down for us through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Where any teaching or necessary spiritual light about what we are to do, is revealed in God's Word, we should not expect (nor need) any further revelation beyond that written Word (of God). Since the Bible contains a <u>complete</u> <u>volume</u> of the Truth of God's Word, it is not necessary for Him to speak directly to us.

We <u>also</u> want to remember that the foremost way Satan would use to deceive us, would be through suggestions to our mind, so we want to measure our thoughts in the light of what God's <u>Word</u> says.

When a person would first come to God in their life, they would be <u>unaware</u> of Satan's deceitful tactics, and if they were not <u>careful</u>, he would get them on an unscriptural course of action that would not be according to God's will. Satan is not <u>new</u> at this, because he has been in the business of deceiving people for thousands of years.

Satan was an archangel and supposed to be in charge of the music in Heaven (the late Pastor said), but he <u>fell from</u> that position. The Bible says that his extreme beauty caused him to be lifted-up with pride, and as a result he fell into sin and rebellion against God. (Ezek. 28:12-13), "This is what the Sovereign LORD says: 'You <u>were</u> the model of perfection, full of <u>wisdom</u> and perfect in <u>beauty</u>. You were in Eden, the garden of God; every precious stone adorned you:" (14) "You were anointed as a guardian cherub, for so I ordained you. You were on the holy mount of God; you walked among the fiery stones. You were blameless in your ways from the day you were created...<u>till</u> <u>wickedness</u> was <u>found in you</u>. Through your widespread trade you were filled with <u>violence</u>, and you <u>sinned</u>.'"

(Satan used his 'power of choice' to <u>rebel</u> <u>against</u> <u>God</u>, just as the devil provides <u>temptation</u> for us to <u>choose</u> to sin and to rebel against placing our obedient trust on God) (many times due to <u>pride</u> in our own efforts of self). (Ezek. 28:) (God continued with His description of Satan's <u>fall</u> and of the judgement that He placed on Satan) (verses 16-17), "So I <u>drove</u> you <u>in disgrace</u> from the 'mount of God', and I <u>expelled</u> you, O guardian cherub, <u>from</u> among the fiery stones. Your <u>heart</u> became proud on account of your beauty, and you <u>corrupted</u> your <u>wisdom</u> because of your splendor. So, I <u>threw</u> you to the earth; I made a spectacle of you before kings."

Satan is <u>still</u> on <u>earth</u> in <u>the</u> form of an 'evil, spiritual being', and he is in charge of all 'spiritual hosts of evil'. (We are told, Ephes. 6:12), "For ours is <u>not</u> a conflict with <u>mere</u> <u>flesh</u> and <u>blood</u>, <u>but</u> with the despotisms (which means dictatorship), the empires, the forces that control and govern this dark world—the 'spiritual hosts of evil' arrayed against us in the heavenly warfare."

From <u>God's</u> account of Satan's <u>fall</u> (because of <u>pride</u> in himself), we can see that <u>'pride'</u> is a <u>deadly sin</u> which the devil tries to put in <u>everyone</u> else to bring them down. He <u>knows</u> that pride <u>will</u> surely cause us to fall and eventually <u>defeat</u> us in our Christian walk (<u>if</u> <u>pride</u> is not <u>removed</u> from our <u>heart</u>). God described what the nature of a human heart is really like, and He promised to <u>change</u> our heart for us—if we <u>allow</u> <u>Him</u> to do that <u>spiritual</u> work) (Jer.17:9-10) "The heart is <u>deceitful</u> above all things, And desperately wicked; <u>Who</u> can know it? I, the <u>Lord</u>, <u>search</u> the <u>heart</u>, I <u>test</u> the <u>mind</u>, even to give every man according to his ways, According to the fruit of his doings."

<u>We must allow God to remove 'pride'</u> and all other wrong attitudes from our heart, no matter what measures it takes for <u>Him</u> to do that <u>for</u> us, because it is an <u>eternal life issue</u>, and <u>we don't know</u> our own heart. (and even less so in the early part of our Christian walk).Paul instructed Timothy that he should <u>not</u> appoint a person new in the Truth to be a leader of God's people (1 Tim. 3:6) "He ought <u>not</u> to be a new convert, for fear he should be blinded with <u>pride and come under</u> the <u>same condemnation</u> as <u>the devil</u>." (We must escape condemnation by our choice to allow <u>God</u> to <u>remove pride</u> and <u>self</u> from our <u>heart</u>).

Our knowledge of God and <u>His</u> <u>Word</u> will develop, however, as we place ourselves in His hands, and allow Him to teach us, and for Him to work on remolding our Christian character. God is always doing <u>His</u> <u>best</u> to develop us in His Truth and teach us, which enables us to understand what <u>is His will</u> for us to do in our life (and begin to recognize Satan's suggestions to our mind). As we will allow Him, <u>God</u> <u>will</u> perfect us in all that concerns us, and <u>above all things</u> He will <u>prepare</u> us for Eternal Life.

At first, we don't know anything about the schemes of Satan, but as we grow and develop in the Truth under God's teaching, we also learn to recognize Satan's thoughts and suggestions to our mind, and of how he works. Neither do we (at first), know much about God and His Word, so we are quite susceptible to the deceitful tricks of the devil (who always tries to put suggestions in our mind to cause us to move away from following the Word of God.)

It is important to understand that the devil's suggestions will seem exactly like our own thoughts (and that is what makes them so very dangerous). You would not think Satan was within forty miles of you, when those thoughts come into your mind (the late Pastor said), and if the devil can get us to think they are our own thoughts, then we would surely accept them (as we have often been guilty of).

All the <u>error</u>, <u>misunderstanding</u>, and all the <u>false religions</u> (and there are a host of them), and <u>every plan</u> of 'fallen man' in the churches (and the world in general), where people are trusting in <u>someone else</u> (or <u>themselves</u>) for things in <u>this life</u>,...are all controlled <u>by Satan</u>. Paul said that Satan <u>is</u> the "spirit that works in the sons of disobedience." (Ephes.2:).

That means everybody who is not in the will of God; everybody who is not under the power of the Holy Spirit, are one hundred percent under the power of Satan. Jesus said, there would be very few under the power of the Holy Spirit (in these closing days of the Gospel).

It is apparent that the vast majority of people are under the full control of Satan, and they are <u>not even 'aware' of it</u>. Satan not only puts every thought into their mind, but he inspires every action (by those thoughts), and people think they are <u>their own</u> thoughts. The <u>point</u> to be made from this <u>is</u> that we have to be extremely careful of any suggestion that comes to our mind. We need to be sure they are according to God's will and Word before we act on them. That will keep us out of a lot of trouble, and hinder Satan from having power over us.

We are extremely <u>fortunate</u> to have a Word of God in our Bible, a volume of Truth that is so complete, and, which gives us all the instruction we need to live a victorious Christian life. It is also <u>all</u> that we need to <u>follow</u>, to have God prepare us for Eternal Life, because <u>He inspired His Word</u> to be written.

God's Word (through the apostle Paul) should greatly encourage us that through <u>believing in Christ</u>, we are <u>free from</u> the "spirit that works in the sons of disobedience." (Ephes. 2:1-2), "To you Gentiles also, who <u>were dead</u> through your offences and <u>sins</u>, which were once habitual(routine) to you while you walked in the ways of this world and obeyed the Prince of the powers of the air, the spirits that are now at work in the hearts of the sons of disobedience"... "to <u>you</u> God has given Life."

It is the result of Adam's sin that we were born in Satan's plan of life, but, by God's mercy and grace our inward nature can (and will be) completely changed (if we allow God to do that for us). [It <u>is</u> <u>God's will</u> for us to give our life back to Him, and to be taught and developed by Him until we become completely Scriptural in everything that we do. This can be a long process in most cases with us, and it can be 'trying' and 'tedious', but it is absolutely necessary and well worthwhile (for it is an Eternal Life issue.)

There are two things, that Scripture proves we can always be sure of (when we <u>surrender</u> our `<u>life</u> of <u>self</u>' and place ourselves in <u>God's</u> <u>hands</u> to teach and prepare us),... and that is,.. all of God's dealing with us (and everything that touches us while we stay in His will),... will always work together for our spiritual good. That may be hard for us to see (at the time we are being tempted), but as we hold steadfast it will work together for good for those who love and obey Him (as Jesus said we must), and, because God cannot be unfaithful to His Word. (Rom. 8:28). "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." (All that God is looking for is a heart that is <u>willing</u> to <u>turn</u> their <u>life</u> <u>over to</u> <u>Him</u>, so that He can teach and develop them (and us), until we all become Scriptural in everything.)

We would have to admit that no real harm has ever come to us when we were <u>in</u> God's will, (nor with any of His dealing with us, and that should be very encouraging). It shows that we are always safe in <u>following God's plan</u>, and staying in His will, so that is where we want to stay to be protected from being deceived by Satan's suggestions to our mind.

There are examples in the Bible where <u>Satan deceived people</u>. In the synagogue at Nazareth, <u>Jesus</u> read from the book of 'Isaiah the prophet'. (Luke 4:18-24), "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim <u>freedom</u> for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him, and he began by saying to them, "<u>Today this Scripture</u> is fulfilled in your hearing."

"All spoke well of him and were <u>amazed</u> at the <u>gracious</u> <u>words</u> that came from his lips. "<u>Isn't</u> this Joseph's son?" they asked. Jesus said to them, "Surely you will quote this proverb to me: `Physician, heal yourself! Do here in your hometown what we have heard that you did in Capernaum.'" "I tell you the truth," he continued, "no prophet is accepted in his hometown."

Then we see how Satan works with suggestions to a person's mind, as the people began saying things among themselves, like, "that's not true. He is not divine. He is only a man like us. He is the carpenter's son. We know his father and mother, and his brothers and sisters. He is just like them."

Those people did not realize for a moment that the change of their opinion, and the thoughts that instantly came into their minds (about Jesus not being divine), were directly from the devil. They thought it was their own sensible conclusions and based on real facts, but they were directly from the devil, himself.

The <u>reason</u> the devil was able to do that was because those people were full of rebellion and sin, without even knowing it. They had wicked, deceitful <u>hearts</u> and that's why the devil could deceive them.

Then, in the time of Elisha there was severe famine in the land, and he was inspired by God to say, (2 Kings 7:1-2) "Hear the word of the Lord. Thus, says the Lord: "About this time tomorrow (food will be sold at market-price) at the gate of Samaria." "An officer of the king said to the man of God, "Look, even if the LORD should open the floodgates of the heavens, could this happen?" "You will see it with your own eyes," answered Elisha, "but you will not eat any of it!"

That officer was trampled to death in a stampede to get the food the next day (because he had been a spokesperson for Satan) and food <u>was</u> sold at market-price at the gates of Samaria,.. just as God had inspired Elisha to tell the people. That man had sin and rebellion in his heart, and that is why he spoke out Satan's suggestions and thoughts without even knowing they were from him. He thought they were his own sensible thoughts. He thought that what he said, was truer than what God inspired Elisha to say, because that officer had a sinful heart and was under the power of the devil, thus, he was inspired <u>by</u> the devil. Elisha, however, (being a man of God because he had <u>allowed God</u> to <u>remove sin</u> and <u>self from</u> <u>his</u> <u>heart</u>), spoke as he was inspired by God to speak.

Elisha's word came true (of course) because God's promises and His power do not take human circumstances into account. Anybody with a knowledge of God would know He was able to do what He said he would, (and that is the way it turned out).

That was a serious thing for that man to lose his life and go to the Lake of Fire forever, because he listened to the devil. That reveals to us the danger of being under the devil's control, by not allowing God to remove sin from our heart. It shows how necessary it is that we be on our guard against the suggestions that come into our mind, and the courses of action that are suggested by the devil. It shows why we should be sure to be well acquainted with God's Word, and to <u>test</u> every suggestion by the Scriptures that speak on that course of action (before we follow through with it).

The devil would like us to think that his suggestions are the Holy Spirit talking to us, but it is the devil appearing as an 'angel of light' (as the Bible warns us about). The devil is trying to get us away from following God's Word. If he can get us away from doing God's will, our faith can be shipwrecked, (at least until we <u>repent</u> and <u>get</u> back to God's Word and doing His will again).

While we are on God's pathway (and doing His will), the devil cannot touch us, but if we get outside of that path, the devil <u>can</u> hit us,... (because <u>we permitted</u> it). It is very <u>valuable</u> for us to <u>understand</u> that when Satan makes trouble for us at any point, the 'will of God' is not being done there, and we are not acting according to Scripture at that point. God will show us the cause and enable us to remedy it. Satan cannot attack us in any place where we are on Scriptural grounds. He will not be able to lay his finger on us.

Anyone who has repented and who are sincere in seeking God, will have many battles, but <u>God</u> will always <u>deliver</u> them. The 91st. Psalm says, "Surely <u>He</u> shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler," (which means every trick of the devil). The devil can put <u>desires</u> in our <u>heart</u> and <u>mind</u> that will be all absorbing (if we permit him to). For example, 'for us to love something (or somebody) more than God',

and then to have us put them ahead of God in our life. If we do, every plan of Satan that we accept, will bring trouble in our life.

There is only one 'sure place' of safety in standing against the attacks of Satan, and that is being in the 'will of God' and having the 'anointing of the Holy Spirit'. (1 John 2:20) "But you have an anointing from the Holy One, and you know all things." That means we have the baptism of the Holy Spirit, and we really should not need anyone to teach us about 'false religions'. The anointing of the Spirit teaches us, and we will be able to detect the devil's schemes (or tricks) when he tempts us. The Holy Spirit will enable us to distinguish between the suggestions of Satan (to our mind), (and the plainly written Word of God), and thus, keep us from being deceived by any thing (or anyone).

Through getting into (and staying in) the will of God (by faith on His Son, Jesus Christ), we will be among those (as 1 Pet. 1:5 says), "who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation." Through the Holy Spirit's guidance (as is promised to every `trusting soul'), we will grow and develop spiritually and get a full knowledge of God's Word, and He will prepare us for Eternal Life in Heaven.

The First Century Gospel Church/Philadelphia

Some Main Points:

1... The Bible contains a complete Truth which the Holy Spirit (Whom God has sent to guide us), will reveal to any `trusting soul'. 2... No further revelation of Words or visions from God are needed, but we need to remember, however, that the devil uses suggestions to our mind to try to deceive us. That is why we trust the Holy Spirit to guide us.

3... We must study and know God's written Word and measure our thoughts in `light of His Word, so we can make right choices in our life, and thus, not rebel against God's Word which can lead us to our Salvation.

4... Satan had been anointed and ordained by God as a 'guardian cherub', but he became filled with pride, used his 'power of choice' to rebel against God, and so, he was cast out of Heaven.
