Truth and tradition are often blended during the holidays, but we can focus more on Tradition and ignore principles of Truth—divine truths concerning our interactions with, and our attitudes toward family members, friends, and fellow believers. Truth comes first—Tradition always second.

Christmas proceeds from the *heart*; it is where our trust on *God* starts—fully depending on Him to enable us to have a Christ-like attitude toward everyone. God in Person visited our world and showed us how His Truth is lived. John 1:14 "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."

The Christmas season reminds us that we *can* have the presence of God in our life—*that* is an on-going *tradition*. When we make the decision to *believe*, God gives us the gift of His *Spirit*—Who enlightens us to understand divine principles of trust on divine power. John 16:13 "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth."

God wants us to *know*; to *understand*; and to *live* within the guidelines of His Truth—being *kind* and *considerate* during family gatherings; showing *respect*, *love*, *patience*, and *forgiveness*

toward everyone—concerning everything. Those we *love*—make sure they *know* it!

Tradition tells us that Jesus was born in a manger in very humble surroundings. Only a few in Bethlehem took the time to visit him when He was born—even though it was an event of *immense* importance—and never to be repeated. Only Jesus, as God in "flesh appearing," can forgive our sins, change our hearts, and get us ready for Heaven—only God!

Tradition recites Matthew 1:21 "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. 22 Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, 23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us."

God wants to give *us* what any loving father would give his *children*. When the Prodigal Son decided to return from a life of sin, his father could then do things for him—likewise, when *we* choose to give our life back to God, He is able to do things for *us*—healing without drugs; food without government checks; protection without insurance coverage; and eternal life by faith in His Atonement.

Truth is in the name Jesus—Jehovah will save—because it is a testimony of God's love for us even before we showed any love for Him. Romans 5:8 "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

Tradition recites a verse—but Truth lives by it. The name Jesus is of great significance—Acts 4:12 "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." To believe in His Name, is to trust on His power. Tradition announces Matthew 1:21 "And she shall

bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS."

Only by faithfully trusting on the Atonement sacrifice Jesus made for us—can our sins be forgiven; our heart be changed; and our life be re-directed toward Heaven. Truth tells us that Jesus—as God—came to deliver us from sin, self, and Satan. God has promised to heal us when oppressed of the devil, if we will confess our sins, believe on His power, and reject the plans of the world.

God has promised to *guide* our spiritual path to Heaven, if we will *trust* Him in faith to do that. And He promises to save us from the lake of fire by His grace alone through our faith in His Son alone, if we will *believe* Him and *act* on His Word. John 11:25 Jesus said "I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live."

All good *gifts* in this life and throughout all *seasons* are from God. Every good gift *from* Him is appropriated by steadfast faith *in* Him. God is doing everything possible to *give* these gifts to those who will believe Him, but the world in general *rejects* them by refusing to *trust* Him in faith.

Tradition has many singing peace and good will during this season, but all too often it is over and soon forgotten. The true meaning of Christmas is to truly have Christ in our heart every moment of every day and in all seasons. We give evidence of good will in our heart by showing love, kindness, and consideration to all people—not only at Christmas but all through the New Year.

Tradition has Christmas cards showing a scene of the angels announcing the birth of the Messiah, but *Truth* tells us that Jesus came to this earth for a very specific reason—to Matthew 1:21 "Save his people from their sins"—by changing their attitude; delivering them from oppression; providing financial needs, and protecting those who trust Him from harm, injury, or loss.

Jesus would surely approve of our recognizing His birth and knowing why He came to earth, but He would *not* want us to commercialize the holiday as the world does, and would *not* approve of our accumulating more and more things.

Christmas is when the world focuses on the Messiah—Emmanuel, God with us—as the Lord Jesus who alone can *change* lives forever, if we are willing to *believe* that Jesus *is* who He *says* He is—God in flesh who came to pay the debt for all the sins of all people in the world.

Tradition recites the verse, but Truth understands the mission of the Messiah; Isaiah 9:6 "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace."

The child who would be born would be a *Savior* for all people from all nations—but anyone *of* those nations must make a *choice*—a choice to *accept* Him as Lord, and to allow Him to *convert* their heart from *rebellion* and *resistance*; to *submission* and *acceptance*—willingly placing their *faith* and *trust* on His atoning sacrifice He made for them.

"Unto us a child is born" tells us that He began life as an infant, and He met with temptations like we all do. Hebrews 4:15 "For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin."

Jesus suffered unspeakable pain when He was crucified on the cross to pay for the sins we committed. God was manifested to conquer Satan and sin—and now God gives spiritual light to those in spiritual darkness—if they will believe and trust Him every day for spiritual light.

Tradition places Bible verses on a Christmas card, but we must also accept the *Truth* it proclaims; Zechariah 14:9 "And the LORD shall be king

over all the earth: in that day shall there be one LORD, and his name one." He must be the one Lord and the only King of our life—and of our attitudes and our decisions.

Luke 17:21 "The kingdom of God is within you," means the Spirit of Christ is within our heart to inspire faith in us to depend on His sacrifice of Atonement for everything—healing without medicine, supplies without welfare, protection without insurance, justice without lawyers, and for every other gift.

Tradition calls Him Jesus, but Truth calls Him Mighty God—which He confirmed by telling Philip John 14:9 "He who has seen Me has seen the Father." The apostle knew that Truth Colossians 2:9 "For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily."

It is a Tradition to give gifts to those we love; but God gave us His Son who showed us His Truth—a Truth we are to believe and put into practice every day. John 15:12 "This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you. 13 Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. 14 Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you." Jesus went on: "For all things that I have heard of my Father I have made known unto you."

The Messiah's arrival was a proclamation of peace and truth; Luke 2:14 "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." Living His Truth includes having divine peace, physical healing, His protection, provisions, and justice, if we will confess our sins to Him.

God's favor rests on those who love Him with all of their heart, and are committed to trust Him for all things in life. God promises His kingdom if we will *repent* of sins, *forsake* wrong attitudes, *accept* His Son as Lord of our life, and will place our *faith* in His Atonement work at Calvary.

John 3:36 "He who is believing in the Son, hath life [everlasting]; and he who is not believing the Son, shall not see life, but the wrath of God doth remain upon him." Tradition says Jesus is Lord; but Truth actively trusts in the Atonement sacrifice He made for us—and enduring in the faith by the power of God. James 1:12 "Happy the man who doth endure temptation, because, becoming approved, he shall receive the crown of the life, which the Lord did promise to those loving Him." Those loving Him are those loving the people right next to them.

Tradition has some people being kind, thoughtful, and considerate for one holiday; but Truth says that every day is the time to be kindhearted toward all people, and a time to make someone feel wanted, needed, and loved. God's Truth means giving and wanting nothing in return—because Acts 20:35 "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

He who created the *universe* and *world* we live on, is here today in the presence of His Spirit—ready to do great things for those willing to trust Him in faith. Far too many never give God anything to do, or they limit His power through unbelief—nevertheless, He is present on earth to *do* marvelous things for those who *ask* and *believe* that He will.

Hebrews 13:5 "Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee." Anything we could need—spiritually, physically, or materially is available from God—by faith in Christ. Our responsibility is to ask and believe He will provide them. John 14:13 "Whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son"—a Truth that stands forever!

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
