WE MUST SURRENDER SELF

(AND GOD TEACHES US TO LOVE AS HE LOVES US)

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We should offer special notes of praise for the way God is working in the lives of His people, everyone who (on a profession of repentance), has surrendered their self-will to do God's will in their life, (as inspired by divine love in their heart). Everyone in whom God can find the opportunity to 'work with us', God is doing that for us as He promised. That is because He loves us (as Jesus said) 'as much as He loves Him'. That is a perfect love!...and it is almost unbelievable that God loves us as much as He loves His only Son. And, the Bible says, that we should love each other as much as Jesus loved us. (He even went to the Cross to die in our place).

There is only one possible way that we can truly love each other. Of ourselves, we could not love one another as Christ loves us. We could not (of ourselves) take the first step toward doing so. We have to get that ability to meet each other right (in the Bible way), and be enabled by God's Spirit to love each other as Jesus loved us.

We have to begin (by <u>our freewill choice</u>) to <u>abide</u> in Christ, and then <u>continue</u> to abide in Him (in a life of faith) until we are developed by the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit into His image. Just <u>to the extent</u> that we <u>willingly</u> abide in the image of Christ (and, desire to do His will only in our life), to <u>that extent</u> we <u>will act like He did</u>. We <u>will be</u> inspired and <u>enabled</u> to love as He loved <u>when our repentance is sincere</u>, and our <u>commitment</u> is real (and <u>final</u>). It could not be otherwise, because God is a Master workman and a great <u>Teacher</u> for any surrendered and <u>willing</u> soul.

Jesus told us the whole story in (John 15:), (and He gave us God's whole plan for our heart to be transformed into having a Christ-like love within). (1-2) "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser." (To be the vine-dresser means that God personally tends to 'each branch of the vine' so we can grow in faith and prosper in the Truth, because He does not want any soul to perish). "Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit." (We only have to make our choice to repent, a final surrender of our life, and be willing to do God's will),.. (and He will do the rest). (4-5) "Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. (Abide in, means to continue). Another rendering of verse 4, says, "Continue in me, and let me continue in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit of itself—that is, if it does not continue in the vine—so neither can you if you do not continue in me."

(The branch that <u>separates from</u> the vine can bear <u>no</u> fruit, but, Jesus said(verse 5), "I am the vine, <u>you</u> are the branches. He who abides (or continues) in Me, <u>and</u> I in him, bears <u>much</u> fruit; for without(or apart from) Me, you can do nothing."

To abide in Christ <u>begins</u> with <u>real repentance</u> and a whole- hearted surrender, placing ourselves in God's hands just as a scholar places him/herself under the direction of a teacher, or an apprentice places himself under direction of an employer. <u>Then</u> our <u>love</u> for <u>God</u> (and for <u>each other</u>) <u>can be made perfect</u>. God <u>loves us so much</u> that He will do His level best to train us and to teach us. It could not be otherwise (than for Him to do His very best for us and with us).

There is really nothing strange or <u>different</u> about the way God will teach and train us to <u>love one another</u>, as <u>He</u> prepares us for Eternal Life. <u>If we</u> will <u>commit</u> ourselves into His hands to be taught and trained <u>by Him</u> (to live a life of faith on His Son and the power of His resurrection), God <u>will</u> 'abide in us' as we 'abide in Him'. Our faith in 'the resurrected Christ' should cover every <u>thing</u> (and <u>situation</u>) that confronts us in our life. God will enable us to <u>understand</u> that, as He also <u>perfects</u> our <u>love</u> for <u>Him</u> (and for our fellow man).

Only God (through His Holy Spirit) can bring us to that place of trust on His Son, and to a realization of the power of His Atonement Blood(shed in our behalf). It is God's <u>new covenant plan</u> for all true believers, (for Jesus said), "This cup is the new Covenant ratified by my blood which is to be poured out on <u>your</u> behalf." We must come to the place that we <u>truly comprehend</u> God's 'new Covenant plan', and

what Jesus really meant in saying that His blood would be poured out on <u>our behalf</u>. The power of His Atonement Blood covers <u>everything</u> in a life of faith on God's Son, and faith on what His resurrection to Life <u>really means</u> and <u>has accomplished</u> for us.

Jesus said that His Father is the <u>vine-dresser</u> (or gardener) and any branch that bears any fruit at all, He works with it and prunes it, that it may <u>bring forth more fruit</u>.

He also said (7-8), "If you abide(or continue) in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. "By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples." That text (rightly under-stood) means that if you continue in the hands of God (to abide in Christ or in union with Jesus the Christ), and the Bible teaching of His Word continues to develop in you,...then you will come to the place where you will know how to pray right (and with right motives), and know how to meet God's easy conditions to receive from Him. You will be brought to the place where(as Jesus said), you can ask for anything you need and it will be done for you. That means spiritually, for our family, for our bodies, our financial affairs, and everything else. It is our divine privilege and a 'blood-bought right' to have every prayer answered. If we meet 'God's easy conditions', He will answer that prayer made in faith.

The fact is, there is not a <u>Scriptural</u> prayer that is offered that is not answered, ..and since God knows our <u>heart</u>, then He knows our <u>motive</u> for making request for those things that we <u>need</u> or <u>want</u>. However, everything that we <u>need</u>, <u>would be</u> a <u>Scriptural</u> prayer to be answered. The <u>only question</u> is, 'the <u>answer' getting in on</u> the <u>receiving end</u>.

When a grocery man brings goods to your home and comes to your door with what you have already paid for, the only <u>question</u> that remains would be <u>the receiving</u> (or the <u>accepting</u>) of the goods. Every thing that we need or every Scriptural desire, every answer to our prayer, and the grace to receive it, '<u>has been knocking at our door</u>', and waiting for us to <u>accept</u> it. That is how definitely we should <u>believe</u> that our prayer is already answered (and our prayers have been answered through the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world).

It is <u>not</u> any <u>new thing</u> that we ask for and receive from <u>God</u>, no matter whether it be spiritually, for our bodies, for our homes, for money, for deliverance out of trouble, (or anything else). We are to <u>believe</u> that our <u>prayer has been answered when we pray</u>, and that we are receiving something that has been on deposit with God for us. Everything that we <u>need</u> (or Scriptural desires we have), has been knocking at our door. That is very <u>important</u> for us to <u>understand!! God</u> has <u>placed</u> those things there <u>through</u> the great work of Jesus Christ. His presence with us (<u>as</u> our great <u>Teacher</u>), is to <u>enable</u> us to see <u>how to receive</u> every need that has already been provided for us. We need to <u>be taught</u> how to enter into every <u>Atonement right</u> in Christ,(and how to receive it by faith).

Of themselves, a person is ignorant of these facts (which is a <u>serious condition</u> to <u>be in</u>), a condition that is <u>made so</u>, because of <u>listening to the lies of the devil</u>. (2 Cor.4:3-4) "If, however, the meaning of our Good News has been <u>veiled</u>, <u>the veil</u> has been on <u>the hearts</u> of <u>those</u> who are on the way to perdition, in whom the 'god of this present age' has <u>blinded</u> their <u>unbelieving minds</u>, so as to <u>shut out</u> the sunshine of the Good News of the glory of the Christ, who is the image of God."

But, God has revealed the meaning of the Good News to the <u>believer</u> <u>by</u> His Spirit..(6) "For <u>God</u> who said, 'Out of darkness let light shine, is He who has shone in <u>our</u> hearts to <u>give</u> <u>us</u> the <u>light</u> of the <u>knowledge</u> of <u>God's glory</u>, which is <u>radiant</u> on the face of <u>Christ."</u>

The believer must remember that the Holy Spirit cannot enter any life that is not willing to follow God's Word, and is not willing to accept it as their rule of life. God gives the Holy Spirit to all those who are willing to obey Him, and God and His services are a free gift. We have a blood-bought right to have the Holy Spirit to guide us (and God is infinitely more anxious for us to have that guidance than we are to receive it). The power of God within us (His enlightenment, His strength, and His ability), enables us to enter into these great gifts, because "God has revealed them to us through His Spirit."

That means, people who have given their life back to God (to receive the Spirit), because Scripture says, (1 Cor. 2:11-12), "Even so no one knows the things of God, except the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not 'the spirit of the world', but the 'Spirit who is from God', that we might know the things that

have been freely given to us by God."

The 'Spirit's presence' in our heart <u>inspires us with divine love</u> for God (and for each other), which opens the way for God's power to work for us, and the Spirit is freely <u>given</u> to all who will repent, <u>surrender</u> their life to God, and believe for it.

We ask God for wisdom to know whether it is His will for us to <u>have</u> or to <u>get</u> something. 'If it <u>is</u> <u>not His will'</u> then we should not want to have it in the first place. When we pray for the Spirit's guidance, we are to believe that He will <u>make known His will</u> to us. The Spirit gives a feeling of <u>ownership</u> so "we might <u>know</u> the things that have been freely given to us by God."

Ownership is a great foundation for faith (even in human affairs). It means that anything that you know is yours and you have a lawful right to have, you can ask for, believe, and receive it. We are not asking God to give us something that does not belong to us (like a creditor asking from a bank). Rather we go to God in prayer because we know it is already ours, as a depositor going to a bank is positively sure that they can get that which is already in their account. The banker is only the custodian.

It is the same with every <u>Scriptural need</u> from God, <u>because</u> it is already ours. A 'fabulous price' <u>was paid for it</u> through Jesus' <u>Blood</u>, and God, Himself could not keep it from us <u>if we</u> have <u>faith</u> to <u>take receipt</u> of it. We have a legal 'Blood-bought right' to have every need and Scriptural request, because it is already paid for (and is on deposit for us).

Aside from that, we <u>have God</u>'s <u>great love for us</u>, which is infinitely <u>more eager</u> for us to enter into our inheritance, into God's righteousness, His peace, health, protection, and <u>needed finances</u>, 'than we are to receive it'. <u>Any problem with</u> the believer taking receipt of something that is already their inheritance through Christ, would <u>always be on</u> the 'receiving end'.

God is always doing His best 'to <u>train</u> us <u>how</u> to receive by faith', and He is using every 'circumstance of life' that <u>we meet with each day</u>, to <u>teach us</u>. There is not a moment that God is not <u>using something</u> to <u>teach</u> and <u>develop us</u> in our <u>Christian life of faith</u>.

We have to be <u>alert</u> and <u>aware</u> that there may be a <u>suggestion</u> of <u>Satan</u> in <u>our mind</u>, trying to get our attention to <u>deceive us</u>, to get us on the wrong track and away from faith to receive our inheritance in Christ. (It took some serious circumstances for <u>God</u> to <u>teach Jonah</u> that <u>lesson</u>.) In our case, it may be a <u>circumstance</u> that is very <u>annoying</u> or unpleasant to us. It could be in <u>our household</u>, <u>the workshop</u>, <u>neighborhood</u>, or elsewhere, (which is permitted by God for <u>our 'spiritual good'</u>). However, God's <u>presence</u> and <u>guidance</u> is promised to those who will <u>believe</u> and <u>obey</u> Him, and He uses <u>every</u> circumstance in our life to teach us how to meet it right (and so, enable us to develop in faith.)

Every time we have any trouble or question of any kind, and we go to God and get a deliverance from <u>Him</u>, our faith is greatly increased, our spiritual light and strength is developed, and we are brought nearer to the image of Christ with our love for God and His Word, and our love for our fellow-mankind (and so, nearer to being prepared for Eternal Life).

We all have to be rid of the 'last human thing of any kind' that we <u>have depended upon</u> (for things that we desire). God will 'bring us to that place' if <u>we allow Him</u> to do so. It <u>is having the self-life removed</u> from our <u>heart</u>, and something that we must allow the Holy Spirit to accomplish <u>within</u> our heart (for <u>Him</u> to <u>prepare us</u> for <u>Eternal Life</u>). This will mean that we would rather die than to trust in anybody but God, or to disobey His Word. "If you love me, you <u>will</u> obey my <u>commandments."</u> (Jesus said John 14:15).

God's <u>Word</u> is <u>like</u> a <u>wilderness</u> as far as <u>human help is concerned</u>, and 'very <u>fortunate for us</u> that it is' (the late Pastor said). It <u>teaches us to trust in God alone</u>, <u>just as wandering in the wilderness taught</u> those <u>Israelites</u>. It <u>eliminates</u> every <u>human plan</u> for help, and that is very important. You could search the Bible from beginning to end, and you will not find one place for a <u>human</u> effort, a plan, or power. The <u>Word</u> of <u>God</u>, presents the <u>living God</u>, <u>as our only</u> helper.

The greatest 'gift of the Atonement' (and the most valuable gift), is the presence and power of God, Himself to <u>guide</u> us. (Think of it) the '<u>Maker</u> of Heaven and earth', everything that is in them (rocks, trees, ocean, mountains, cold and heat), and 'the <u>creation of human life'</u> (the most wonderful of all His creation). The God who made all of these things has <u>promised to guide</u> us (if we will allow Him to do so). (John 16:13), "But when He has come—the Spirit of Truth—He will guide you into all the truth."

God has proved to anyone who will listen, that regardless of the <u>difficulty that Adam's sin plunged us into</u>, or what dangerous a place we may find ourselves, He can deliver us out of it (<u>if we will repent</u>). He will not only deliver us, but He will <u>teach</u> us <u>how</u> to <u>receive</u> our <u>victory</u> by <u>faith</u>. '<u>That</u> is what God can do' for any willing and believing soul!!

God proved that He can do anything for us (beyond all shadow of doubt), <u>by</u> 'the resurrection of Christ' from <u>the dead</u>. Man's <u>greatest enemy</u> 'the devil' (all the opposition and power of God's enemies in the world, flesh and the devil and death in itself) all <u>tried to hold God</u>'s <u>only Son</u>, <u>Jesus Christ</u>, in death in the grave. However, without any difficulty (almost instantly), God raised Him from the dead (<u>to Life</u>). Well, if God delivered Jesus Christ from such a place as that, there is not anything that could happen that God could not deliver us out of. And, to <u>turn it</u> into a blessing for <u>us</u>, as He did for His Son.

All that God's <u>Word</u> ever teaches, is, that 'we are to <u>trust</u> in God alone'. <u>Trusting God</u> would be <u>obeying Him</u>, and it would prove that our <u>love for Him</u> and <u>His Word</u> is 'being <u>made perfect'</u> (while <u>He also inspires us</u> with a <u>love for each other</u>). The Bible says that <u>we</u> should love <u>each other</u> as much as Jesus loved us, <u>because</u> (Jesus said) that God loves us as much as He loves <u>Him</u>. <u>That</u> is a <u>perfect love!</u> .. (and <u>we are to be like Him</u>). When the 'image of Jesus Christ' is <u>developed</u> in <u>our heart</u>, it enables us to take a <u>right attitude</u> of <u>love</u> toward God <u>and</u> to our fellow-men. Our <u>believing</u> God's <u>Word</u> about His Son, (our <u>repenting</u>, and having a willingness to learn about having divine love in our heart), <u>allows</u> us to <u>receive</u> the gift of the Holy Spirit to lead us to our goal of Eternal Life. <u>The goal</u> to which God is working (if <u>we</u> will <u>allow</u> Him), is to bring us to the place where we will be <u>rid of</u> every <u>source</u> of human help (and every human <u>thing</u> we are depending on)until we are fully dependant on the living God alone.

That is being made into the image of Christ which would inspire <u>divine love</u> within <u>our heart</u>. It will mean our full Atonement inheritance in Christ, perfect happiness here, and best of all it will mean <u>our preparation</u> for 'Eternal Life'

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THE FIRST CENTURY GOSPEL CHURCH/ PHILADELPHIA SOME MAIN POINTS:

- 1. God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the Cross in our place, because He loves us as much as He loves His Son. That showed us HIS perfect divine love for us.
- 2. Jesus said, this is my commandment to you, to love one another as I have loved you (John 15:12),... (but we cannot do that of ourselves).
- 3. When we make our choice to repent, surrender the self-will, and to abide in Christ in obedient faith, the Holy Spirit will do the rest, and He will enable us to love one another.
- 4. "Continue in me, and let me continue in you", (Jesus said). Just as the branch cannot bear fruit of itself(that is, if it does not continue in the vine)—so neither can you if you do not continue in Me." (John 15:4).

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
