Purity of a Christian Heart

(Via God's Holy Word)

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'Purity of heart' is <u>essential</u> to the true Christian life, however, it is not something that we can see or feel within ourselves, rather, it is received <u>through</u> faith on God and His Word and is <u>kept by faith</u> on <u>His</u> power to <u>lead</u> us to salvation.

There have always been professed 'believers' who have never had their hearts purified in the 'true Bible way' (which means it is accomplished only by the power of God). The main thing is that it is one thing to receive heart purity and another thing to hold on to and maintain a pure heart (by faith). Our Salvation is not like something kept in storage (the Pastor said), rather, it should be kept through a continual stand of faith on God every day and not depending on anything but the power of God to keep it for us. It means a heart which is constantly being kept pure and clean by God's grace and power. It means that we are to make a final choice to 'stay connected' to the true Vine (Jesus Christ) through faith on His Word which leads us to 'Salvation'. (1 Pet. 1:5 says), you "who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation, ready to be revealed in 'last time'."

Our hope of Salvation is not like power kept in reserve (in a storage battery), rather, it is staying connected to God's divine power so that we can move forward in the true Christian life, (just like the (old-time) electric bus-trolleys had a pole which had to stay connected to the overhead wire in order to move forward). Our faith for Salvation should not be a dependence on anything but the power of God to purify our heart (by whatever means it takes Him to do so), as we live up to our responsibility to stay connected in faith (to the true Vine). It is a new 'stand of faith' every day.

Jesus told His disciples to pray daily for whatever physical spiritual, or temporal blessing they would need. (Luke 11:2-3), "He said to them, "When you pray, say, 'Father may Thy name be kept holy; let Thy Kingdom come; give us day after day our bread for the day;" (Notice that Jesus' prayer began with the daily supply of our financial needs, and then He related to the far more important need, which is our 'spiritual interests'). (4) "And forgive us our sins, For we also forgive everyone who is indebted to us." (That means to ask God to keep our heart pure and clean from wrong attitudes and resentment (hidden or otherwise). "And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the 'evil one'." He meant deliver and protect us from Satan and his attacks, and his power this day. Keep us free from the devil's attacks.

According to these Scripture verses (given by Jesus), it is God's work to do these things on a daily basis (which He has obligated Himself to do for us). Our responsibility is to remain connected to the true Vine, trusting on God through His Son, so that God can purify our heart and prepare us to receive His promised Salvation (for true 'believers' in the faith). (Rom.11:20-21) "yet it was their unbelief that cut them off, and you only stand through your faith. (connected to Christ). Do not be puffed up with pride. Tremble rather--for if God did not spare the natural branches, neither will He spare you."

Our <u>staying connected</u> to the true Vine, Jesus Christ, to have our heart purified and made ready to receive Salvation, can be compared <u>to</u> the pole on the electric trolley car, which is its <u>means</u> of power (forward movement) <u>while it is on</u> the overhead wire.

Our faith touches the 'promises' of God just the same as the trolley pole touches the wire. While we are walking by faith on God's promises (maintaining a sincere faith for our heart to be purified by God), our heart will be kept purified (according to 1 Pet.1:5), you "who are kept by the power of God through faith for 'Salvation'." (If we do not exercise faith in God for things we need and circumstances in this life (which we can see), how could we ever begin to exercise faith in God for something so important as our Salvation (which we cannot see with human eyes). It is something that we must see (in faith) through spiritual eyes. God is the only One who can enable us to see that, and to be "kept by the power of God through faith for salvation", (1 Pet.1:5).

When we <u>cease</u> to <u>exercise faith</u> on the 'power of God' to do <u>that</u> for us, we <u>lose</u> our heart purity and will go backward spiritually. We may be <u>thinking</u> that we are not so bad after all, but <u>not</u> being able to <u>meet</u> things <u>right</u>, and <u>not</u> able to <u>exercise faith</u> to receive our victory (is a terrible position spiritually). In many instances, we can find ourselves having more confidence in the <u>lies</u> (and <u>plans</u>) of Satan, than we have in the plans and <u>Word</u> of <u>God</u>. It becomes a real <u>fact</u> to ourselves (as to our true spiritual condition). (Rom.2:29 says), "true circumcision is <u>heart-circumcision--not literal</u>, but <u>spiritual</u>; and such people receive praise not from men, but from God."

After have made we corrections. confessed to God (and to our fellow man, if necessary), and forsaken every wrong attitude or mistake we have made(or any other sins that God has revealed to us to be made right in our life), then we should believe on the authority of God's Word that our heart has been purified, by placing those things under the Atonement Blood of Christ. We should then have confidence to exercise faith to receive our victory. (1 John 3:21-22), "Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence toward God. And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight."

People often pray in contradiction to what is really in their heart (the Pastor said), because their heart has not been made right with God. It would be to our benefit for us to take a good look at what status we really believe our heart to be in, to understand (and know) what we are really believing, and where we actually believe ourselves to be in our spiritual life. Do we (or do we not) see and believe through God's Word, that our hearts have been made pure and clean, because His Word tells us what His Son accomplished on the Cross to cleanse, pardon, and free us from sin. There is no half-way place in the 'spiritual life', so we must be one place or the other. What do we really believe about ourselves at this moment? (is the question we should ask ourselves).

God's Word gives us <u>His</u> plan of what we <u>should believe</u> we <u>are</u>, and <u>where</u> we should (in faith) see ourselves spiritually. (Whether or not

we see or <u>feel</u>, it makes no difference). <u>God's</u> plan is for us to <u>believe</u> that our heart is pure through <u>faith</u> on the <u>authority</u> of <u>His</u> <u>Word</u> that Jesus' Blood has cleansed our heart.

The apostle Paul said, "We are to 'walk by faith, not by sight'" (or feeling). We are to <u>believe</u> something when God's <u>Word says</u> it is <u>so.</u> <u>To take</u> our victory <u>in faith</u> on God's promises to deliver us in time of trial, <u>is</u> to "walk by faith, not by sight", and it will <u>always include</u> a 'spiritual blessing'. We are "kept <u>by</u> the power of God <u>through faith</u> for <u>Salvation</u>." (1 Pet. 1:5).

God's plan is that we are to <u>maintain</u> an ongoing <u>faith</u> on His Word and 'promises', and to <u>believe</u> that we <u>are</u> as His <u>Word</u> says we are.(Gal.2:20), "I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I that live, but Christ that lives in me;" (Our believing that Christ lives in us, <u>is believing</u> that our heart has been purified by His Blood).. "And the life which I now live in the body I live through faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up to death on my behalf."

The moment we take the stand of faith on God's Word (that we are delivered from sin, and that our heart is purified by the Blood of Christ), the devil will put all his skill and deceit into play, to try to convince us that we are not cleansed through Christ's Blood. He will use every possible suggestion to our mind, trying to cause us to think we are not purified, and that we have not met the conditions to sincerely repent and believe that we were freed from all desire to sin.(as God's Word declares to us, because of Jesus' shed Blood). (Rom.6:6) "This we know--that our old self was nailed to the cross with Him, in order that our sinful nature might be deprived of its power, so that we should no longer be the slaves of sin;"

The <u>devil</u> will then <u>tell</u> us that if we ever <u>had</u> a clean heart, we must have <u>lost it</u>, and then try to <u>convince</u> us <u>of</u> that, through every method he has learned in his six thousand years of deceiving people. That is where the <u>fight</u> <u>for</u> our faith comes in.

But (Rom.6:11 assures us, however), "In the <u>same way</u> you also <u>must regard yourselves</u> as dead in relation to sin, but as alive in relation to God, <u>because</u> you are <u>in Christ Jesus."</u>

We should be <u>encouraged</u> from God's Word that we are a true believer. (1 John 4:4) "As for you, dear children, you are God's children and

have successfully resisted them; for greater is He (God) who is <u>in you</u>, than he (the devil) who is in the world."

The devil fights against a faith that is believing for perfect peace of mind, health and protection, peace in our home, and salvation for ourselves and our household. Our privilege, however (and all that is made possible through the Holy Spirit), is to maintain our truly repentant and forgiven attitude of heart (made possible by the shed Blood of Christ). Satan knows we have that privilege in Christ, so if he can get us to question that attitude, or get us to doubt God's Word (and to be on the fence about whether our heart has really been cleansed and forgiven God's Word says), he (Satan) then <u>undermine</u> and <u>rob</u> <u>us</u> of faith (in every part of our life).

The <u>doubt</u> the devil puts in our mind will hinder our answers to prayer, prevent us from meeting things right in the home-life, and in financial matters. The devil will <u>try</u> to make us afraid of being in a drafty place, or of getting our feet wet for fear of catching a cold. If we feel a little pain in our back, he will try to make us think that we have some serious physical problem. It may <u>sound</u> <u>surprising</u> that the devil will try to undermine a faithful heart (a heart that has been made pure by the Blood of Christ), <u>but</u> if he does succeed, he can then get in with <u>doubt</u> on <u>every</u> point, and a real <u>spirit of fear</u> will overtake us.

We must be definite in refusing Satan's doubts and fear in the 'Name of Jesus Christ', so the devil will have to flee from the power of Christ (whose resurrection to Life defeated the power of the devil). If we are not definite in refusing the devil's thoughts (in the Name of Jesus), the devil's suggestions of doubt and fear will soon have more weight than God's Word, (and God's Spirit of love, power, and wisdom). The point to be made (and the one thing we need to do), is as Solomon admonished (Prov.4:23), "Above all else 'guard' your heart",(or) "Keep your heart with all diligence" (which means give the sincerity of your heart your full attention), "For out of it spring the issues of life." If we do not keep our heart with all diligence, waver and doubt will come almost immediately (because that is how quickly the devil works to destroy the faith of anyone who will allow him to do so, instead of refusing him in the Name of Jesus Christ, who defeated the devil's power, when He (Christ) rose to Life.)

We have God's promise (of the inspiration of His Holy Spirit) to keep us from wavering if we will believe and take our stand of faith on God's Word to enlighten us to understand His promises. (1 Cor.2:10-11) "For us however, God has drawn aside the veil through the teaching of the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, including the depths of the divine nature. For, among human beings, who knows a man's inner thoughts except the man's own spirit within him? In the same way. also, only God's Spirit is acquainted with God's inner thoughts." Verse 12 then gives us all the assurance of the Spirit of God that our faith in God should ever need. We must believe that we have received. (12) "But we have not received the spirit of the world, but the Spirit which comes forth from God, that we may know the blessings that have been so freely given to us by God."

Jesus had promised his disciples that same Spirit (John 14:26), "But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send at my request, will teach you everything, and will bring to your memories all that I have said to you."

[The main point to consider; .it is the work of the Holy Spirit who will enable us to understand God's promises (because that is what God assigned Him to do for us). He cannot work for us, however, if we are not walking by faith in the Word of God, maintaining a conscience that is clear of offences toward God and man (through our purity of heart). We must stay connected by faith to the true Vine, Jesus Christ!! (Rom. 11:20), "yet it was their unbelief that cut them off, and you only stand through your faith."

God has given us Scripture verses meant to assure and encourage us in our stand of faith on God. (John 15:4) "Continue in me and <u>let me</u> (that is our choice) let me <u>continue in you</u>. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit of itself--that is, if it does not continue in the vine (Jesus said) so neither can you <u>if</u> you do <u>not continue</u> in <u>me</u>."

If we continue to maintain a pure heart; if we continue to <u>believe</u> the Word of God; if we continue to hold on to the our heart purity through faith in God, and hold onto the indwelling of Jesus Christ in our heart; if we continue to abide in Him, we will be able to ask for whatever Scriptural desire we may have, and we shall receive it. We

must <u>remain</u> <u>truly</u> <u>consecrated</u> to Christ, through <u>believing</u> that He is still <u>within</u> us to sanctify (or purify) our heart through His <u>Word</u>. "You are already clean because of the <u>Word</u> which I have spoken to you." (John 15:3)

This means that we are always purified through the Word, <u>not</u> by sight or feeling, because faith only works through a spoken or written word (<u>not</u> by something we can see). There is <u>no faith</u> involved when we can already see something (as a <u>human heart</u> always wants to do).

Spiritual faith works the same as faith in everyday things. If we <u>see</u> our car parked outside of our home, we can say, "I will drive the car to the supermarket". There is <u>no faith involved</u>. However, if a family member comes home and says, 'I parked the car out front, (even though we have not yet <u>seen the car</u>), we have faith in their <u>spoken</u> word that the car is outside. We can (in faith) say, "I will drive the car to the supermarket."

That is the way our faith should work in believing <u>God's written</u> Word in all the promises that He inspired to be written for us to <u>read</u>, <u>accept</u> (in faith), and claim fulfillment. When Jesus said, "You are already clean because of the <u>Word</u> which I have spoken to you." (John 15:3), that means we are to believe that our heart is purified through His Word (not by what we feel).

The Pastor said he received many letters from people, saying, "I had such a wonderful experience, but it is <u>all gone</u> now. They tell us they surrendered their life to God (and had real joy), but after a while, that wore off, and they do not know how to explain it. The <u>reason</u> is they walked entirely depending on good feelings, and by what they could see to trust on (instead of walking by faith on God's Word). It was like they drove a stake on their experience and walked around it. In most cases, they never purified their hearts through the <u>Word</u> of God (so they were not sanctified ("kept by the power of God through <u>faith</u> for Salvation").

After a person's heart has been cleansed (by the precious Blood of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit), we are to consecrate (surrender) our life to God, to have <u>Him</u> purify our heart. That means putting aside forever <u>all</u> our efforts of self and self-trust. (Matt.5:8) "Blessed are the pure in <u>heart</u>, For they shall see God."

(In <u>summary</u>) a wonderful feeling or experience is not faith at all, because real faith only works through believing on a spoken (or <u>written</u>) <u>Word</u> of God. We are to purify our heart by faith on God's Word. Jesus told His disciples that they were clean through <u>the Word</u>, and they <u>accepted</u> their heart purity (through that Word). That is the way <u>we all are to receive</u> 'purity of heart', "<u>kept by</u> the <u>power of God</u> through <u>faith</u> for Salvation" (1 Pet.1:5).

1...
