WE RECEIVE THROUGH JESUS NAME

(WHEN WE BELIEVE AS WE PRAYED)

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One of the most important subjects that we could consider, would be God's condition for receiving in Jesus' Name, as it will have Eternal Life results. So, when that is rightly understood it can open the way for God's power to be manifested in our personal life, with our family (and in all other ways). There are only two sources of information regarding this life-giving subject, and of course it is God's written Word that tells us the real Truth of the matter, while we know that God's Word does not change. The devil, however, has always worked hard to convince people that God has changed, and that we can no longer receive answers to prayer from God through the Name of Jesus.

However, the <u>Scriptures</u> tell us that God and His <u>Word</u> has <u>not</u> changed, and that the Atonement Blood of Christ <u>is</u> <u>as</u> <u>efficacious</u> <u>today</u> (as it was in the first century from where we read of God's almighty power working on behalf of all those who called on Him in the Name of His Son, Jesus). The Scriptures also clearly reveal that God loves us as much as He loves His only Son, whom He gave up for us when we were without strength and ungodly. That is the greatest expression of God's love for us, which is a pure, unselfish, and perfect love, and we all have a <u>privilege</u> to prove <u>for</u> ourselves the <u>extent</u> of God's love for <u>us</u>.

The Bible also reveals (by teaching and by examples of faith and trust), that God is always willing to hear and answer every prayer we make, concerning every Scriptural need or desire that we may have in this present life. It is our responsibility (and choice) to turn to God in faith or turn to some other source of supply or deliverance). We need to truly understand (and believe) that we have a God who never changes, and we have a living Christ who is "the same yesterday, today, and forever", because the Bible tells us so. (Heb. 13:8).

Therefore, we were given a <u>Gospel Message</u> that has <u>never changed</u>, a Holy Spirit who is the <u>same</u> today as He was in Bible times, (<u>and</u> an Atoning Blood sacrifice that can <u>never lose</u> its

<u>power</u>). This all means that the 'standard' of a true Christian life is exactly the <u>same</u> as it was in Bible times, (and that the <u>conditions</u> for receiving Eternal Life and of receiving answers to prayer are also the same). God, <u>and</u> Christ His Son, have <u>not</u> changed, <u>nor</u> has the <u>Holy Spirit of God and His Son</u>.

Satan, on the other hand, has had one main object for thousands of years, that is, to convince people that God had changed, and that He does not hear and answer prayer for things we need in this life.

The <u>devil</u> is a <u>spiritual</u> <u>being</u>, so he can put thoughts and suggestions in the mind of anyone who has <u>not</u> fully surrendered their life to God, and so, still have the old evil nature of the self-life in them. All the devil's thoughts and suggestions to a person's mind, might <u>seem</u> exactly <u>like</u> their own, and <u>seem</u> to be founded on <u>fact</u>; but they are <u>lies</u> direct from the *father of lies*, Satan himself.

Satan also <u>uses</u> a multitude of so-called religious <u>teachers</u> in the world to be a <u>mouthpiece</u> for him, to <u>confirm</u> those wrong thoughts he puts into people's minds concerning that <u>lie</u> (that God has <u>changed</u>). He also does this through those false teachers' deceptive <u>written</u> <u>teachings</u> (religious books and opinions), as well as by 'word of mouth' from them.

What could be more wicked, slanderous, and displeasing to God, than for one to paint His character as being opposite to what He really is? The large majority of professing Christians who have accepted that lie from Satan, have been robbed of the blessings Jesus died to give them in this life on earth (as well as losing their hope of Eternal Life). To believe the lie of Satan that God no longer answers prayers (for healing, finances, His peace within ourselves), will effectively hinder a person from living up to God's requirement of "believing on the One whom God has sent" (the main condition of God's Will for saving us).

Instead of believing Satan's thoughts and suggestions to our mind, (that God will not answer our prayers), we need to refer back to God's Word, which tells the real truth of the matter. When God's Word says that the Atonement Blood of Christ provides, protects, delivers, and heals, that Truth is what we must believe, (rather, than the devil's lies that God has changed from what He was in Bible times).

We can easily <u>recognize</u> the <u>plan</u> that <u>Satan</u> <u>used</u>, to <u>deceive</u> the <u>professed</u> <u>Christians</u> in the third century (the late Pastor said). The <u>early</u>

<u>Church</u> (especially when the Roman Empire <u>professed</u> to <u>accept</u> the Christian religion), the church (in general) <u>lost its spirituality</u>; the <u>answers to prayer ceased</u>; and <u>every other manifestation of God's glorious <u>presence</u> and <u>power (as was manifested</u> at <u>the beginning of the Gospel Age)</u>, all came to an end.</u>

Satan had convinced those fallen (or unenlightened) church members that they were still good Christians. Also, that, naturally the only possible reason for the lack of God's presence and power, was because God had changed, and that He was no longer willing to do things that He had done at the beginning, when the early Church had put 'God's Truth' into practice in their life.

That terrible <u>delusion</u> and most wicked <u>slandering</u> of our loving God's <u>true</u> <u>character</u> has continued ever since that time. There have only been a <u>handful</u> (here and there) who have <u>gotten</u> <u>back</u> to really <u>trusting</u> God, gotten <u>back</u> to really <u>believing</u> His Word, and back to the real <u>truth</u> <u>concerning</u> God's <u>willingness</u> to hear and answer every Scriptural prayer for things in this present life.

The main object that Satan has (in getting people to believe that God will no longer hear and answer prayer), is to rob them of the great spiritual blessing that always accompanies answered prayer. The sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit is to perfect our Christian character, and which results in our spiritual growth and a preparation to meet Jesus Christ when He returns, to take true believers with Him.

(Heb.12:12-14 instructs us) "Therefore strengthen the drooping hands and paralyzed knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put entirely 'out of joint' but may rather be restored. Persistently strive for peace with all men, and for that growth in holiness, apart from which no one will see the Lord."

The <u>devil knows</u> that every time a person <u>deals with God personally</u> (and they <u>receive answer to</u> their <u>prayer</u>), (and <u>not telling anyone</u> of their problems and needs, but instead, going to God alone in a private prayer of faith), that person also receives <u>spiritual light</u>, <u>growth and development</u>, an <u>increase of faith</u>, and <u>most importantly</u>, a real step of progress in their <u>preparation</u> for Eternal Life. Many Bible examples have <u>proven</u> the <u>spiritual value of answered prayer</u>.

(2 Chron. 20:) illustrates for us, how Jehoshaphat's <u>faith</u> <u>was</u> <u>perfected</u> through one <u>encouraging</u> <u>answer</u> <u>to</u> <u>prayer</u>. He went to God in prayer and settled it final to lay aside every human plan and power. He was committed to look to God alone for all his help when three armies came against him (and the Israelites). This attitude of absolute faith in God and <u>not</u> giving in to the <u>fear</u> which the devil surely <u>tried</u> to put in his <u>mind</u>, brought an immediate answer to prayer and a great victory over the enemies.

Aside from the victory, they also received a great quantity of supplies. After three days of gathering the spoil of the enemy, they met in the Valley of Berachah (which means happiness), to praise and thank God for His mercy and love. The 46th Psalm reveals the great spiritual blessing received by Jehoshaphat (and the Israelites). It was the perfection of faith, which carries every other spiritual blessing with it. (Vs.1-3), "God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble. Therefore, we will *not fear*, Even though the earth be removed," (that is the kind of spiritual grace and strength that is received through having faith in God), "And though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; Though its waters roar and be troubled, Though the mountains shake with its swelling."

Many people believe that these verses refer to events to take place in the *end times* yet to come. <u>True believers</u> whose faith in <u>God</u> has been perfected <u>by Him</u> (through <u>trusting in</u> Him), will <u>not fear</u> those terrifying events, while Scripture tells us that the <u>unfaithful</u> of the world will cry out in fear and try to hide anywhere they can.

These <u>verses</u> reveal to us that the answer to prayer received from God, gave Jehoshaphat and the Israelites <u>confidence</u> that they were <u>delivered</u> from any possibility of ever again fearing. They prove that Jehoshaphat's <u>faith had been perfected</u> by God, for he did not <u>compromise</u> his love <u>for</u> God by turning to some other source of help.

The Apostle John tells us (1 John 4:18) "There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love." (meaning, there, is something imperfect in their love for God's Word).

As Jehoshaphat would <u>endure</u> in the <u>faith</u> (resulting from his <u>love</u> for <u>God</u> and His Word, as fear did not cause him to disobey God's Word) so

God would also protect him <u>from falling away</u> from faith. (Jude 1:24-25), "To Him who is <u>able</u> to <u>keep</u> you <u>from falling</u> and to present you before His <u>glorious presence without fault</u> and with great <u>joy</u>, to the only God our Savior be glory, majesty, power and authority, <u>through Jesus Christ our Lord</u>."

That one answered prayer gave to Jehoshaphat, what God is trying to accomplish in all our lives, that is, a "faith which worketh by love" (Gal.5:6). Paul said this was the only worthwhile thing in our life as a Christian, (because an uncompromising love for God will inspire an obedient faith in God). (John 14:21) "He who has my commandments and obeys them-he it is who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and will clearly reveal myself to him."

That <u>means</u> to have Christ manifested in <u>us</u>, through our obedient faith in Him (as Paul explained, Gal. 5:5), "For we <u>through</u> the <u>Spirit</u>, <u>wait for the hope of righteousness by faith</u>."

(Matt.8:) gives us another example of the valuable spiritual blessing that came with one answered prayer. A Roman army captain asked Jesus to heal a servant (who was very sick). Jesus said that He would come and heal him. The captain, however, told Jesus that he was not worthy to have Jesus come to his house, but to speak the Word only, and his servant would be healed. When Jesus heard the man say that He marveled and said to those following, that He had "not found such great faith, no, not even in Israel." (the man was a Gentile).

Jesus then revealed the great spiritual blessing that came as a result of taking that uncompromising attitude to God's Word. (Vs.11-13) "And I say to you that many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. But the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." Then Jesus said to the centurion, 'Go your way; and as you have believed, so, let it be done for you.' And his servant was healed that same hour."

In saying this, Jesus gave the man a through ticket to Heaven (or the promise and assurance of Eternal Life) (which verifies that Eternal Life is a present possession through faith in Christ). [The man met the condition of answered prayer, a final decision to depend on God alone, and a willingness to accept God's Word as the only evidence that his

prayer has been heard and answered. (That is the step of faith that we all need to take on God's written Word.) In fact, the man preferred the Word of the Lord to actually seeing the healing work done. All the professed children of God who were rejected (from the Kingdom), had taken the opposite attitude to God and His Word.

So, first we have <u>teaching from</u> the <u>Bible</u> concerning faith for <u>answered prayer</u>, then we have all the <u>examples</u> that <u>illustrate how</u> that teaching is to be <u>applied to</u> the circumstances in <u>our life</u>, and then, what <u>perfect results</u> always follow <u>when the teaching of the Scriptures is applied through faith</u>. This <u>means</u> that <u>if</u> we <u>apply</u> the teaching about the Truth of God's Word in our life (just as they did), and we get the same results, we have <u>found</u> the <u>real Truth</u> of God, <u>and</u> we have <u>gotten back to God and His Word</u>. It <u>is</u> having faith in the <u>unseen God by believing</u> on His <u>written Word</u>, instead of <u>falling</u> to <u>the temptation to seek deliverance from a source that can be seen.</u>

Paul describes how <u>our</u> faith in the <u>unseen</u> is to be applied, (also how it is <u>meant to work for us, with eternal</u> results). (2 Cor.4:17-18) "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working <u>for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, while we do not look at the <u>things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen</u>. For the things which are <u>not seen</u>, but the things which are <u>not seen</u>, are <u>eternal</u>."</u>

Romans 8:31-32 gives us an excellent revelation of God's <u>willingness</u> to hear and answer prayer for <u>everything</u> we could possibly need or desire (that is <u>within</u> *His will* for us). "What then shall we say to this? If <u>God</u> is on our side, <u>who</u> is there to appear against us? He who did <u>not withhold</u> even His own Son, but <u>gave Him up</u> for <u>all</u> of us, will He not <u>also with Him</u>, freely give us <u>all things?"</u>

When <u>God tells us</u> that He gave us the greatest gift, His only Son, (when we were <u>without strength</u> and <u>ungodly</u>), that is a fact, and (an <u>unanswerable argument</u>). So, how could it be possible that He would not give us every <u>needed</u> thing or Scriptural desires, which are all of much <u>lesser</u> value than Jesus Christ? This would include <u>everything</u> in this present life (which is to be received from trusting <u>God</u>), and it will also be a step forward in <u>our preparation</u> for Eternal Life (as well as our <u>setting and being</u> a <u>true example</u> for <u>our children</u>, that of trusting (believing) in God's <u>Word</u>

for things in this life).

Because he <u>believed</u> God's <u>promise</u>, the Bible <u>says</u> of <u>Abraham</u> (our leader in the faith), (Gen. 15:6) "And he <u>believed</u> in the Lord, and He (God) <u>accounted</u> it <u>to him</u> for <u>righteousness</u>.@ (Psalm 103:17-18) <u>assures</u> us, "But the mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting, On those who <u>fear</u> Him, <u>And</u> His <u>righteousness</u> to <u>children's children</u>, To <u>such</u> as <u>keep</u> His covenant, And to <u>those</u> who <u>remember</u> His <u>commandments</u> to <u>do them."</u> (A Promise of true righteousness passing on to our children, to help keep them on the pathway to Eternal Life!)

These promises from Scriptures, that our believing on God's Word is accounted to us for righteousness, should make it many times more important for us to realize why we must set the example to pray and receive in Jesus Name (not place our trust on other source of supply or deliverance). "To those who remember His commandments to do them", means to heed God's requirement to believe on the One whom He has sent."

That <u>fact from Scripture</u>, that righteousness (spiritual blessing) is received <u>from believing on God's Word</u>, is <u>meant to be carried</u> over to our children <u>(and to their children)</u>, <u>should make us all stop and think</u> when we are <u>tempted</u> to <u>make a wrong decision</u> regarding our <u>place of trust</u>. (Our children are <u>watching</u> and <u>learning</u> from us). (Prov. 22:6 instructs us), "<u>Train up</u> a child in the <u>way</u> he should go, And when he is old, he will not depart from it."

If we are tempted to go against the Bible teaching on not keeping company with unbelievers (those outside the true faith, or who have turned their back to the Truth), we must consider the example that we are setting for our children, who we are instructed to "train up in the way he should go". Aside from our own spiritual condition and preparation for Eternal Life, what could be more important to us than to have that same spiritual condition and preparation for Eternal Life for our children and grandchildren.

It can be a humbling thought to consider (when we are tempted to think that ..."it won't matter" how we decide on an issue where a principal of Truth is involved). It is a most important decision for where we place our trust... is the Christian life in one phrase. It was accounted to Abraham as a righteousness' that reaches to

children's children.

The Promises that Jesus gave to us, should be assurance for us, as to where we should place our trust (Matt. 7:7-8) "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. "For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened."

So, if we are <u>tempted</u> to place our trust on some <u>other</u> plan for deliverance (or source of supply), we must know that our children are <u>watching</u> and <u>learning</u> from us. It is <u>not only</u> our <u>own</u> preparation for Eternal Life that <u>is</u> involved.

Praying and receiving (in Jesus' Name), is indeed a most important subject for everyone to consider and to fully understand. It opens the way for God's power to be manifested in our personal life, with our family (and in all other ways). The 'true value' of the 'spiritual blessing' received, cannot be put into words.

The Gospel Message has never changed. The Holy Spirit is the same today as He was in Bible times, and the Atoning Blood sacrifice of Jesus Christ can never lose its power. So, the real standard of a true Christian life is exactly the same as it was in Bible times, and the conditions for receiving Eternal Life as well as receiving answers to prayer, are exactly the same.

(Jude 1:20-21 is a vivid reminder for us) "But you, my dearly- -loved friends, building yourselves up on the basis of your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit, must keep yourselves safe in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ which will result in the Life of the Ages."

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MAIN POINTS:

- 1. By teaching and example, the Bible refutes the main object of the devils intention, which is to convince people that God has changed, and that God will no longer answer our prayers.
- 2. However, the Gospel Message has never changed and will not change, the Holy Spirit is still the same today, and power of the Atoning Blood sacrifice of Christ will always be the same.
- 3. Thus, the standard for receiving answers to prayer in the true Christian life, and conditions for receiving Eternal Life are exactly the same as they were in Bible times.
- 4. With an attitude of absolute faith like Jehoshaphat had, we can also pray and receive in Jesus' Name.
